

### Mollet to Face Rough Going in Finance Debate

French Chief to Stake Government on Vote On Saar Issue

PARIS (AP)—The Suez fiasco and the unending Algerian war have brought French Premier Guy Mollet under increasing political attack, but most political observers agree the government is not in danger—yet.

The trouble might come when the bills roll in and the budget must be voted in January.

By then, if he makes it, Mollet will have been 12 months in office, a postwar rarity in France. Until now he has weathered the Suez crisis with far less difficulty than British Prime Minister Sir Anthony Eden.

The job which has hurt Mollet worst came from 17 deputies in his own Socialist party. Declaring themselves in line with Britain's Labor party in condemning the Suez affair, the 17 protested that the government's "pacification" policy in Algeria had also failed and should be scrapped. They demanded the immediate calling of a special party congress to discuss the next moves.

There has been sniping too from the far left, right and center of the National Assembly.

Perhaps because of these indications of dirty parliamentary weather ahead, the Premier today sought and obtained from the Cabinet permission to stake his future on a confidence vote when the Assembly debates the treaty returning the Saar to Western Germany next week.

But the biggest threat to Mollet will come in January, just a year after he took office. With military expenses outrunning estimates and tax receipts down—both largely because of Suez—the 1957 budget may be largely outdated even before it is voted.

By then too the worst may be known about the economic effects of the blocking of the Suez Canal. Gasoline normally gives a big revenue boost to the government, which nets about 48 cents on every gallon sold. The planned 30 per cent cut in its consumption will slash tax receipts an estimated \$385,700,000.

That is just a beginning. Three quarters of the oil used in France goes to industry in various forms. Tax losses because of reduced production in steel, automobiles, glassware, etc., cannot yet be calculated. Nor can the possible unemployment which may result through cutbacks.

That's when the storm may really break around Mollet.

### Petrovs Get Citizenship In Australia

SYDNEY, Australia (AP)—Vladimir Petrov, former third secretary at the Russian Embassy who exposed a widespread Soviet spy ring, and his wife are now naturalized Australian citizens.

The official Commonwealth Gazette listed their names today among those granted naturalization certificates.

Petrov fled from his post in the embassy at Canberra in April 1954 and exposed the spy network. When Russian officials tried to take his wife, Evdokia, back to Russia under armed guard, Australian authorities disarmed the guards. Mrs. Petrov decided to join her husband in political asylum.
