USF Risks 60-Game Streak in Basketball

Olympians Whip Dons in Non-Counter

Now comes the 48-hour period that Coach Phil Woolpert and the San Francisco Dons must have thought would have them twisting and turning.

The Dons take major college basketball's longest winning streak ever into George Huff Gym in Champaign, Illinois, to meet Illinois' unbeaten Big Ten favorites.

If the string, now standing at 60, still is intact, then there's a Western Kentucky's racehorse, the Hilltoppers Wednesday in Louisville.

Illinois Ranked 7th

Both the Illini, seventh-rated in the last Associated Press poll, and Western, ranked 12th, take a lot of beating in their own halliwack.

The Dons, NCAA champions the last two years but something less than invincible since Bill Russell and K. C. Jones departed, learned what it feels like to lose over the weekend—but it was a loss that didn't count.

Russell, Jones and others of the U.S. Olympic championship basketball team spilled the Dons 83-52 in the windup of an invitation tournament at Chicago Stadium Saturday night. Since the Olympians are no longer collegians, the game didn't affect the Dons' record.

Illinois, warming up for San Francisco, made Loyola of New Orleans its third straight victim 83-71 Saturday, and such acknowledged powers as Kansas, North Carolina, Southern Methodist, and West Virginia stretched their winning strings.

Washington, beaten by Will Chamberlain and the top-rated Kansas Jayhawks 77-3 Friday night, tried triple-teaming the Still in the rematch Saturday. Will, who got 30 points with two defenders working on him in the first game, bedeviled the extra man too and scored 37 while the Jayhawks made it four in a row for the season, 92-78.

North Carolina went into overtime to edge South Carolina 90-86, and SMU smothered a good Xavier of Ohio team 92-71 as Jim Krebs hit for 37.

West Virginia toppled unbeaten Duke 83-82 to win the Birmingham Classic.

Louisville, always among the nation's leaders, bounced back from its loss to Canisius to whip Marquette 75-68, and St. Louis made another bid for attention by defeating LSU 86-52.

Stiff Penalties Hit Hoop Club For Violations

North Carolina State Fined for Role in Getting Star

RALEIGH, N.C. — North Carolina State College Monday faced the Atlantic Coast Conference's stiffest penalty—a \$5,000 conditional fine and curtailment of its basketball recruiting activities—for its method of recruiting basketball star Jackie Moreland.

In a telegram released Sunday by N. C. State Chancellor Carey H. Bostian from ACC Commissioner James Weaver, Bostian said State was ordered to refrain from contracting any prospective basketball player for one year.

Previously the ACC had charged Moreland transportation money from his Minden, La. home to Raleigh and also offered Moreland a fifth year of financial help in school if he needed it.

The kicker on the fine announced by the ACC was that it will be canceled if Moreland stays at State without "athletic eligibility" and under his present scholarship arrangement.

The college has denied the charges against it and Chancellor Bostian said the penalty will be appealed.

Weaver said that the NCAA acted against State last month on the basis of a signed statement by Moreland made to the executive director of the NCAA in Weaver's presence.

Moreland, a 6-8 sensation, enrolled at State last fall after signing a letter of intent at Texas A&M and a grant-in-aid at Kentucky.

Bears Back as Champs After 10 Years; to Meet New York

Lions Lose 38-21; Title Game Is Dec. 30

Their names were Luckman, Sprinkle, Kavanaugh and Turner then now they call them Casares, Brown, Hill and Meadows. But they're still the Chicago Bears and once again they're champions of the Western Conference in the National Football League.

It took them 10 years, six of them in the runner-up slot, to make it back into the sun, but you don't rebound quick in the tough pro loop. Ask the Detroit Lions. After three title years, the Lions slumped to the cellar in '55. Then this season they roared back all the way—until yesterday when the Bears slapped them down 38-21 in the crucial contest at Wrigley Field.

The Chicago triumph followed Saturday's 21-7 New York Giant victory over Philadelphia that gave the Giants the Eastern crown. The Bears and Giants meet Dec. 30 at Yankee Stadium for the world championship.

In other games yesterday, Pittsburgh stunned Washington 23-0; the Chicago Cardinals defeated Cleveland 24-7; San Francisco rolled to down Baltimore 30-17; and Los Angeles rolled over Green Bay 49-29. That wrapped up NFL action for the season, with the exception of Washington at Baltimore next Sunday.

Yesterday the Bears rolled like feared "Monsters of the Midway," the glory handle they earned by manhandling the NFL in the early '40s.
