"If this implication is borne out by your announcement, those of us who oppose such action will have to do what we can in Congress to counteract such a decision in order to protect the Three Sisters wilderness area and to achieve a sound and predictable program for these areas throughout the country." Morse said.

Last month Morse asked Peterson to make no decision on the boundary matter for a year so that discussions could be carried on with interested parties, including conservationists who oppose the reduction.
