An All-Scout skating party for members of all the units of both Boy and Girl Scouts in Silverton will be enjoyed at the Skateland rink in Salem on March 12.

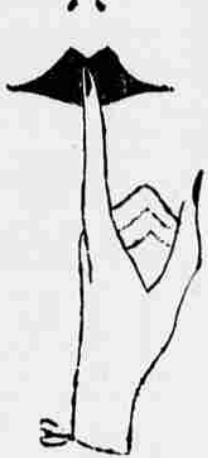
