BERLIN (AP)—Hoping to tame its restive students, East Germany's Communist rulers today announced plans for sending some of them into factories and fields one day a week. Communist party boss Walter Ulbricht said his advantages over capitalism. The party chief spoke to students at Halle. Unrest among East German students became acute after the anti-Soviet eruptions in Hungary and Poland. The students have been demanding freer discussions and an end to compulsory studies of the Russian language and Communist theory.
