

Union Boss Protests Award of Contracts

Firm Owned by Ross Kin Said Blacklisted

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP)—The president of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers Union reported to the union's general executive board that the government has awarded large contracts to a Tennessee garment company despite what he said were labor law violations.

He said the firm was blacklisted by the Department of Labor from December 1946 to February 1948 for sanitation and overtime violations.

He said the head of the firm is Herman D. Wynn, a brother-in-law of Robert Tripp Ross, assistant secretary of defense now on leave.

Ross, who became a defense official in 1954, has said he severed all connections with both the Southern Athletic Co. and Wynn Enterprise, Inc., in February 1952, and that he owns no stock in either.

Defense Department records show that the two firms and certain affiliates were given contracts totaling more than \$7,700,000 since 1951. Ross' wife, Mrs. C. Wynn Ross, heads Wynn Enterprises.

In reporting to his union's general executive board, Potofsky said the Southern Athletic Co. paid employees back wages under the minimum wage law in 1948 and again in 1954.

"We question the wisdom of the government favoring the kind of people not maintaining the proper labor standards," said Potofsky. "They should not get special consideration and it looks like these people have been getting it."

Ross began his leave from the Defense Department Jan. 12 pending completion of congressional investigations of an Army contract awarded Wynn Enterprises for 249,000 pairs of cotton trousers. The contract was valued at \$834,150.

Ike to Send Up 2 Messages in Next Few Days

Views on Immigration Law Changes, School Construction Due

WASHINGTON (AP)—Republican congressional leaders got word from President Eisenhower Wednesday that he will send two special messages—an on school construction and immigration law revision—to Congress in the next week or so.

Senate GOP leader Knowland of California told newsmen after the lawmakers' regular weekly meeting with the President that the school message may go to the Capitol this week.

The administration wants a four-year, \$1,300,000,000 program of federal aid for school construction. A similar proposal bogged down last year after an amendment was attached barring aid to school districts resisting racial integration.

The other message, expected some time next week, will outline the Eisenhower program for revision of the immigration and nationality act, and revival of the refugee relief law which expired last Dec. 31.

That message will chart the administration program on admission of more than 21,500 Hungarian refugees. Eisenhower already has authorized their admittance, but wants Congress to provide for giving all of them permanent residence status. A good many of them have been brought into the United States as parolees on a temporary basis.

Secretary of the Army Brucker sat in at Wednesday's White House conference to discuss administration plans for dealing with the military reserve and operation of the National Guard. Knowland declined to elaborate on that, except to say that the administration plan would require no new legislation.
