Customarily, when heads of forcing states visil Washington, Congress issues such speaking invitations to them.

But some leaders suggested today Congress might lengthen its customary Easter recess so it would be out of town while Tito is here.

Although there has been no official amouncement, there have been indications from diplomatic injuries that Tato will visit the United States — as a guest of President a Eisenhower—some time in April.
