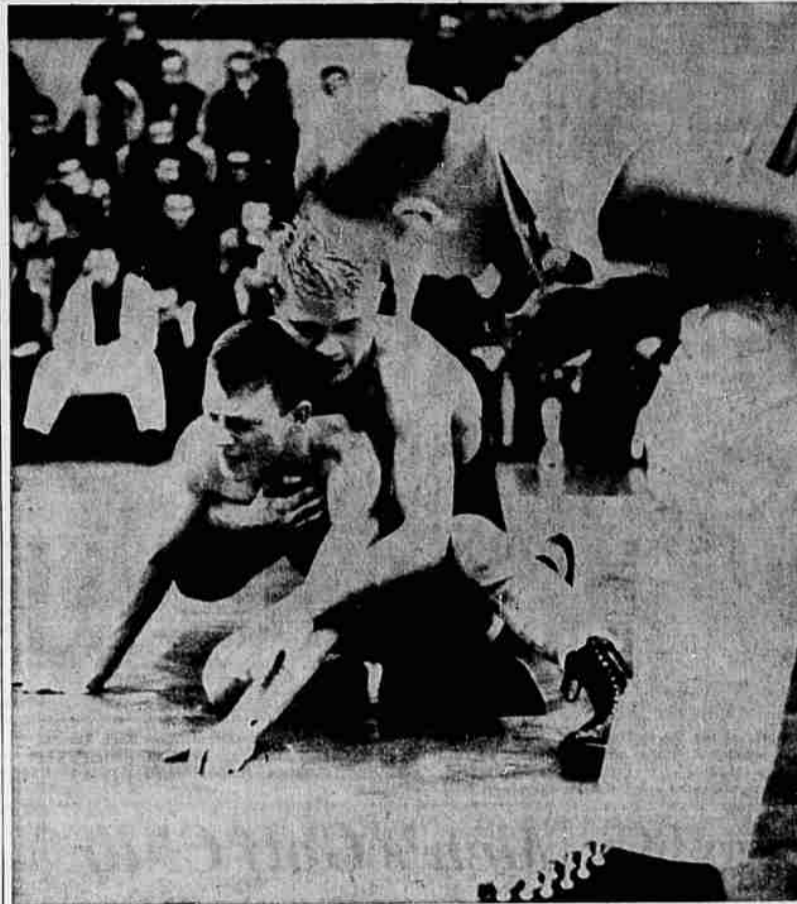

Spartans Minus High Scoring Fleming

The District 8 A. 1 game at Corvallis offers a break for the Vikings because Bruce Fleming, the Spartans' highest scorer, still is out with a broken bone in his right hand.

Baylor Ranks 5th in Major College Tally
NEW YORK (U) — Seattle's Elgin Baylor ranks fifth among major college basketball players, while South Carolina's Grady Wallace and Mississippi State's Jim Ashmore have moved up to challenge Wilt Chamberlain and Chuck Forte.

Baylor has scored 435 points in 19 games for a 23 point average. With Chamberlain, the 7-foot Kansas ace and Forte, Columbia's little hotshot, idled by mid-term exams, Wallace and Ashmore used a couple of top production games to make it a 4-man race.

Wallace hit 43 points against the Citadel Monday to boost his per game average to 23.4, while a 38-point show against Memphis State raised Ashmore's average to 29 even.

Chamberlain, the leader from the start, remains first with a 39.6 mark with Forte right behind at 29.7. Figures from the National Collegiate Service Bureau include games through Jan. 25.
