

Drama Group At WU Plans 'The Victors'

The Willamette university drama department production of "The Victors," by Jean-Paul Sartre, will be held March 1 and 2 in conjunction with International Theatre Month, being celebrated by hundreds of theaters in the U.S. and abroad during March.

The movement is sponsored in the U.S. by the national commission for UNESCO, American Educational Theatre association, and the National Theatre Arts council. International Theatre Month encourages community, educational and professional theatre productions of plays which demonstrate universal themes.

The Willamette drama department chose "The Victors" as its 17th contribution this year because of this play's theme of the value of individual worth in a war-torn world.

The drama, which will be presented in the Fine Arts auditorium, is concerned with the French underground during World War II. Cast includes Jim Chittick, Wayne Haverson and Mac Baker, Salem; Wayne Harris, San Mateo, Calif.; Tom Caylor, San Francisco; Mary Beth Van Cleave, Silverton; Ross Stephen and George Nelson, Bend, and Jack Knapp, Portland.
