Mill Workers Scold NLRB, Name Officers

SEATTLE on — The Western Council of the Lumber and Saw-mill Workers' Union criticized the National Labor Relations Board in a resolution at its closing convention session here Thursday.

The resolution calls for steps to reverse the trend of the board's decisions so they will carry out "the intent" of the Labor-Management Relations Act. Officers elected by the 400 dele-gates, representing 72,000 workers in nine western states, were:

John Gamblin, Eugene, Ore., president; Joe Hazard, San Francisco, vice president; Earl Hartley, Seattle, executive secretary; James Gonzales, Montell, Calif., conductor, and John Moore, Tacoma, Wash, warden.

The convention also adopted resolutions for holiday pay and improved vacations.

If the resolutions are approved by union locals, they will be in-corporated into contract demands. The proposal calls for one week's vacation after one year of work, two weeks after two years and three weeks after five years. The council also recommended that strike benefits be tax exempt.
