Rev. White Has Been In Salem Since June

Rev. Boone L. White, pastor of Morningside Community Methodist church, and his wife, Florence, came to Salem last June because they liked the out-of-doors where they could camp to their hearts' delight. They found plenty of wide-open spaces, but Rev. White admits that they are having a little difficulty in getting adjusted to the rain.

Then, too, they like the community spirit of the people with whom they are affiliated out on South 12th street. Because of the newness of the church plant, there has been much to be done. Volunteers have taken care of many projects.

Likes the Outdoors

When the Whites arrived they found a church plant that was virtually new, a modern parsonage and a congregation that is made up primarily of young couples who are growing up with the community.

Rev. White's given name of "Boone" may indicate he may be related to the well-known "Daniel." Although the pastor's family was well known in Kentucky, he has no knowledge that he is a descendant of the famous hunter.

While attending Drew, Rev. White had plenty of opportunity to try out his preaching techniques as a modern circuit rider. Each Sunday he delivered sermons to congregations located at Port Ewen, Rifton and Esopus, all located on the west shore of the Hudson river opposite Hyde Park, ancestral home of President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

His next assignment was at Central Methodist church, Skokie, Ill., where he held the position of associate pastor.

Rev. White's wife, Florence, is a native of the Kansas wheat country where she taught school in the elementary grades for five years. Both have been greatly impressed with the quantity and wide variety of fruit that is produced in the Willamette valley.

This Will Make Group Self-Supporting Immediately

A budget of \$22,199, which will enable the congregation to become self-supporting immediately, has been adopted by Westminister Presbyterian church. The adoption follows formal organization by a commission of Oregon Presbytery of the United Presbyterian church, presided over by the Rev. John C. Nevin, D.D., Portland.

The Board of American Missions has been paying the salary of the minister since the start of the work last year. This is the first mission congregation of the denomination to achieve self-support at the time of its organization.

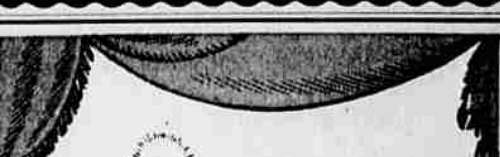
