Tom Monaghan May Face Choice Of Legislator or Schoolmaster

By GORMAN HOGAN Associated Press Writer The time may be coming when Tom Monaghan of Milwaukie will have to choose between being a member of the state House of Representatives and a schoolmaster.

The 34-year-old representative already has introduced a proposal for a constitutional amendment providing "that no teacher shall be disqualified from sitting in the legislative assembly by reason of his being a teacher."

Before agreeing to do this, though, the board decided to get a ruling from Thornton. The decision, according to the Milwaukie teacher, held that a teacher couldn't hold positions in more than one branch of the state government at one time.

Monaghan, a strapping black-haired 6th grade teacher now on leave of absence, considers the ruling "downright discrimination and says he's puzzled by it all."

What puzzled Monaghan is the fact that Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton issued a ruling in 1954 saying there was nothing in the constitution to forbid a teacher from being a candidate for the Legislature.

"I'm hired by school district No. 1 at Milwaukie under contract and consider myself a state employee," he says. "Under this decision a school janitor couldn't legally sit in the Legislature and either could a school bus driver."

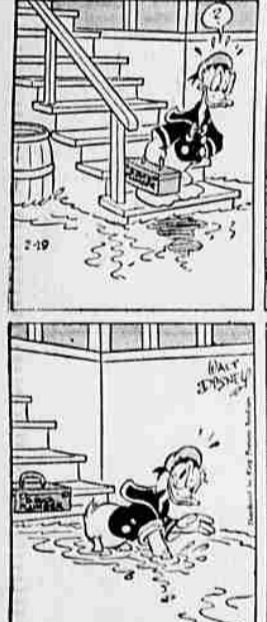
