



Ship Out of State

Some 20 per cent of Oregon's poultry and rabbit slaughtering plants ship their products out of state, a recent survey, made by the department of agriculture,

shows. The plants range in size from one-man operations to those em-ploying more than 100 persons and the monthly staughter at the plants runs from 150 birds to around 600. The survey was made in 49 processing plans, which was rough-to about 30 nor cent of those outpy about 80 per cent of those oper-ating in Oregon at the time if was made. It showed about one-seventh of the rabbit and poultry plants uess, and almost one-third of those surveyed devoted half or more of their operations to custom kill. One third of the plants operate five or more days a week
