

Molalla Eyes New High for School Budget

Furniture Purchase Raises Cost of Operation

MOLALLA (Special) — A special Molalla grade school board meeting was held Monday evening, with the budget committee meeting with the board. The school's budget for the 1947-48 school year was prepared and will show a slight increase, due to increased debt and paying more interest on school bonds.

An item was included to purchase needed school equipment for the new auditorium-gym, such as chairs, stage properties, and five rooms of school furniture. When school bonds were voted recently there was not enough money to provide for these purchases, reported school superintendent T. L. McBride.

Salary of an additional teacher also was one of the items making an increase in the new budget, as an additional teacher will be added to the faculty for the coming fall term, McBride stated.

Board members each brought a budget committee member with him. Ron Dicken was named chairman of the budget committee and others are Dr. T. F. Johnson, Harold F. Ridings, Adolph Kraxberger and Fred Purvine. Board members are chairman Wayne Schumaker, Cecil Snyder, Dr. R. C. Storey, Ossie Marson and Wallace Sawtell.

Guard Seeks Enlistments At Woodburn

Tank Company Target Set at Fifteen Volunteers

WOODBURN (Special) — The Woodburn National Guard tank company will participate in "National Guard Muster Days," the second annual nationwide recruiting program, Feb. 22 through 24. Target of the Woodburn drive will be to sign up 15 recruits to bring the unit to full authorized strength of 108 enlisted men and six officers.

The local campaign will climax on Sunday, Feb. 24, when the Woodburn guardsmen will hold open house at the armory. Recruiting teams will go out into the north Marion county area to contact all young men 17 to 35 years of age eligible for enlistment. Parents are invited to come to the armory to get information on the armed forces act and the national guard. A medical officer will be present and army intelligence tests will be given.

Purpose of the "National Guard Muster Days" is to fill the ranks with eligible young men up to 26 years of age willing to take six months active duty for training as proposed by the department of defense starting April 1 of this year. However, the six months training duty will not be mandatory for those enlisting in the guard prior to April 1. Persons taking the six months training and putting in 4½ years in the National Guard will have their military obligation completed.
