Trial Set for Burning of Cross on Lawn

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Four men charged with trying to erect a cross on the lawn of a Negro family newly moved into a white neighborhood are scheduled for trial tomorrow.

The four, arrested Saturday night, posted bonds of \$500 each within a few hours of their arrest. Five policemen were hidden in shrubbery at the residence of Frank Legree and seized the men as they dug a hole in which to stand the kerosene-soaked cross.

Their leader was Fred B. Hockett, 51-year-old carpenter and a member of the Seaboard White Citizens Council. The others arrested were Frank L. Foster Jr., 29, James McSwiney, 45, and J. E. Shaver, 47, all of Miami.

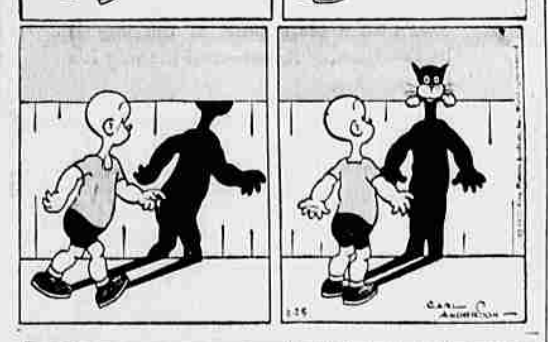
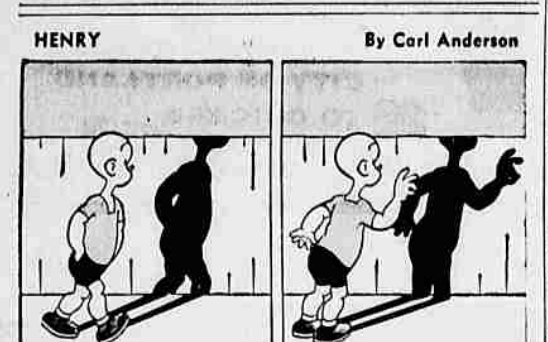
Japan Premier Resigns Post

TOKYO (AP)—Prime Minister Tanzan Ishibashi resigned today because of ill health. The chances look bright for Foreign Minister Nobusuke Kishi, who narrowly missed getting the post last December, to succeed him.

Ishibashi, 72, took office only two months ago. Within a month he was stricken with bronchial pneumonia and a weekend heart. He never was able to attend a session of the Diet (parliament) as Prime Minister.

Late last night his doctors announced Ishibashi would be bedridden another two months, and today the Prime Minister and his cabinet submitted their resignations, to be effective upon the selection of a successor, probably next week.

150 REBELS SLAIN
ALGIERS (AP)—About 150 Algerian rebels were slain in clashes with French troops over the weekend, French headquarters announced Monday. The most important action took place in the Medea region, where 90 rebels were killed.
