### O'Brien, Kuts Earn Honors

LOS ALTOS (UP) — Parry O'Brien, world record holder in the shot put, and Vladimir Kuts, Russia's double Olympic distance champion, today were named the world's greatest track and field athletes in a poll taken by Track and Field News, international monthly magazine.

Kuts, who set new olympic records in the 5000 and 10,000 meter runs at Melbourne, was named the greatest athlete in the sport, polling 48 per cent of the votes cast.

O'Brien, with 26 per cent was runner-up and was named the best of all the world's field athletes with 79 per cent.

In the voting for top track man Kuts drew 83 per cent to 29 per cent for Bobby Morrow, triple U.S. gold medal winner. Jerry White, Corcoran, Calif., was voted top prep school star. He lowered the interscholastic 440 record to 46.7.

Coach Ducky Drake of UCLA, who took his team to the NCAA championship, was named U.S. coach of the year.
