Planning for the project, Larsen said, hinges on negotiations for lease currently being conducted with some half a dozen firms.

Situated on a block-size tract, the shopping center would include a large, one-floor structure with facilities for four to six establishments, Larsen said. Ample parking would be provided, he said.

Construction will be started in May or June if negotiations are successful. Plans call for location of a variety of firms in the center—such as food, variety, hardware, drug and apparel stores.


