

# Boeing Will Design 'Chemical Bomber'

SEATTLE (AP)—A Boeing Airplane Co. spokesman said Tuesday Boeing has been awarded a \$3,250,000 contract for continuing design studies of an "advanced type bombardment aircraft beyond the B52."

The award came from headquarters of the Air Materiel Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Dayton, O., the spokesman said. He added that the company could not give any further details.

# Tranquilizer 'Hurts Brain'

HONOLULU (UP)—A researcher said today one of the most widely used tranquilizing drugs appears to impair the functions of the brain.

In a copyrighted article appearing in the Honolulu Advertiser, Dr. Stanley D. Porteus was quoted as saying that use of the drug chlorpromazine may cause a person to lose his capacity to plan, as well as his initiative, his creativeness and his drive.

Porteus is professor emeritus of psychology at the University of Hawaii. He is widely known as an Australian author and psychologist who in 1955 was named one of the 14 "most important contributors" to clinical psychology by the American Psychological Association.

Porteus carried out his tests with chlorpromazine at the Territorial Mental Hospital, the Advertiser said.

The drug is widely sold on doctors' prescriptions to ease tensions. Used with another drug called reserpine, it has helped mental institutions treat disturbed patients.

# Cook to Serve 3-Year Term For Making \$1

PORTLAND (AP)—Edward L. Martin, a 53-year-old cook from Baker, Monday was sentenced to three years in a federal prison for printing an imitation \$1 bill.

Both he and another Baker cook, D. A. Langford, 44, earlier pleaded guilty to another charge of conspiring to violate the federal counterfeiting act. Langford was placed on probation for two years.

Martin testified he made the bills to be used in a scheme to convince investors that crudely made bills could be turned into excellent imitations by putting them in a chemical solution.

He told the court he never intended to pass any of the counterfeit bills, planning only to find "investors" for his process. Langford said he did not help make the bills.
