

Ike Will Start Cruise Tonight From Norfolk

Press Corps of 24 Goes Along on 2 Escort Destroyers

WASHINGTON (UP)—President Eisenhower, hitherto a dry land and blue skies president, sets out to sea today in hopes balmy southern breezes will wait away his winter cold.

Mr. Eisenhower, in his first voyage aboard a warship since becoming president, was scheduled to sail southward tonight from Norfolk, Va., aboard the guided missile cruiser USS Canberra. His eventual destination, after a leisurely, six-day cruise, is Bermuda where he will arrive on the afternoon of March 20 for a four-day meeting with British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan.

The President thought first of Arizona, then southern Florida, as possible rest spots before going to the Bermuda conference. But early this week he decided an ocean voyage would offer a better opportunity for rest and relaxation.

The Navy swung into action and came up with the Canberra, the nation's second guided missile cruiser, and two escorting destroyers—the William M. Wood and the Barton. A group of 24 reporters, radio-TV men and photographers will travel aboard the smaller vessels. A small presidential staff will be aboard the cruiser.

The President was scheduled to fly to Norfolk, leaving Washington this afternoon and arriving in time for a visit to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's Atlantic Fleet headquarters at Adm. Jerauld Wright before boarding the Canberra.

Sailing time from Norfolk was about 7 p.m. EST. After six days and nights of cruising, the Chief Executive is due in the harbor of Hamilton, Bermuda, next Wednesday afternoon.

Hubby of Beck Aide Attempts Suicide by Gas

LOS ANGELES (UP)—Labor relations expert Leo Kotin, 48, whose wife is secretary to Teamsters Union President Dave Beck, was given emergency treatment Wednesday after what police listed as an apparent suicide attempt because he couldn't "compete" with Mrs. Kotin's career.

Officers said they found Kotin on the floor of his gas-filled apartment after receiving a telephone call from Mrs. Kotin in Washington, who had just talked to her husband by phone. They quoted her as saying she feared her husband might kill himself.

Officers said several gas outlets were open in the apartment. They said they found a note reading: "To wonderful Annie, I couldn't compete with her first love, her career is with the teamsters. There is no room for me."

Kotin has worked as a labor consultant for the past two years. He has also served as a federal mediator in Washington, Portland, and Seattle.

Nazis 'Did Not' Build Saucers

WASHINGTON (UP)—James H. Doolittle says it "just ain't so" that Nazi Germany developed a flying saucer and a bomber that could attack the United States and return without refueling.

The veteran airman, chairman of the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, gave a House Appropriations subcommittee his estimate of reports published in Germany of great aviation accomplishments under Hitler. These were contained in a book by Rudolf Lusar, former German War Ministry special weapons chief.

Doolittle's testimony was published Thursday, along with that of Hugh L. Dryden, director of the advisory committee.

Dryden said "there is no truth" in a statement that German engineers designed a flying saucer which attained a height of 40,000 feet and speed of 1,250 miles an hour.
