

Tidal Wave Warning System Extended to 3 Pacific States

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Coast and Geodetic Survey announced Thursday it will extend its tidal wave warning system to include predictions for the shores of California, Oregon and Washington.

Rear Adm. Robert W. Knox, acting director of the survey, said a civil defense authorities on the Pacific Coast asked for the extension. In the past the survey has notified West Coast states of the alerts it issues at Honolulu.

There has been little damage along the coast, however, from tidal waves of any source.

The warning system was established in 1948 after the great tidal wave of 1946 that killed 173 persons and caused 25 million dollars damage at Hilo, Hawaii. In 1952 and again earlier this month the survey warned the Hawaiian Islands of heavy waves and no lives were lost.

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rine earthquakes, although not all such quakes create waves. At its observatory in Honolulu the survey first calculates the location of a shock. It then determines from tide observation stations in the area whether a wave actually has started.

Although the time it will arrive at distant points can be predicted, there is no way of determining its height or the damage it might cause.

The survey said the new service may not be started for several months, since it requires preparation of special "wave travel time" charts.

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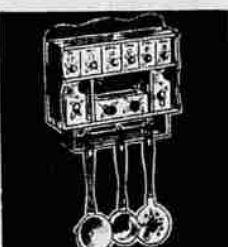
