Who's Got Whom?

When you feel a sturgeon working earnestly on the bait, you get a firm grip on the rod and hau bag like a stevedore. Their mouths are hard, and plenty of heave is necessary to set the hook. Once set, however, the hook seldom pulls out. You've got the sturgeon, or, in some cases, the sturgeon's got you.

Small sturgeon come in limply, somewhat like an old boot. But higger sturgeon often put up quite a long fight Because of their weight, they can bulldog it until your arm muscles turn into jeffy.

Sometimes sturgeon will actually jump, but this is not a common occurrence.
