

Rose Bowl Beavers To Open Spring Grid Practice on Friday

17 Lettermen on Squad, But 12 Graduate

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis (Special)—It's "back to work" Friday for Oregon State's defending Pacific Coast conference football champions who begin their 20-session spring practice period at that time.

Coach Tommy Prothro, who took over grid fortunes at OSC when the Beavers were cellar occupants and raised them to a 2nd place finish in 1955 and an undisputed championship in 1956, lost 12 lettermen from his Rose Bowl team but still has the nucleus for another strong title contender.

Daniels' Knee Heals
Lettermen from '56 returning are Tony Arana, Ted Bates, Nub Beamer, Jim Brackins, John Clarke, Bob DeGrant, Earnel Durden, Dwayne Fournier, Joe Francis, Sterling Hammack, Dave Jesmer, Gary Lukehart, Bob McKittrick, Buzz Randall, Ed Rogers and Ted Searle.

Another letterman, guard Ron Daniels, played on the '55 team and missed last year because of a knee operation. Reserve holdovers include Spiro Anagnos, Jack Hogan and Bob Milum, while the only transfer eligible this spring is Arnold Metcalf, 225-pound tackle from American River JC in Sacramento.

If Prothro were asked to name a tentative starting lineup for next fall at this point, it probably would consist of an all-lettermen eleven consisting of Fournier, LE; Jesmer, LT; McKittrick, LG; Randall, C; Brackins, RG; Bates, RT; DeGrant, RE; Searle, QB; Francis, LH; Durden, RH; and Beamer, FB.

Freshmen Blossom
Best of the sophomores-to-be include Jim Raack, end; Ed Kaohela, tackle; Ladd McGowan, guard; Clive Brown, center; and Jim Sinnette, George Thompson, Stan Glass and Jerry Doman, backs. The 1956 freshman team split two games with the Oregon Frosh and dropped a 7-6 decision to the Washington Frosh at Seattle.

The Beavers undertake another stiff schedule in 1957, meeting two midwestern foes in addition to eight conference opponents. Opening game is a night encounter in Portland on September 21 against Southern California, and then in order the Beavers must play Kansas, Northwestern, Idaho, UCLA, Washington, WSC, California, Stanford and Oregon.

In two years at OSC, Prothro's teams have won 11 Rose Bowl games, including the Rose Bowl defeat by Iowa last New Year's day. Under Prothro, Oregon State compiled the best two-year mark in the PCC ever by a northern member of the league.

Impressive Win Needed to Get Title Bout

CHICAGO (U)—Spider Webb of Chicago, No. 3 middleweight contender, will be under orders to try for a knockout Wednesday night in aiming for his 20th straight victory against Randy Sandy.

Webb is a 2-1 favorite in the nationally televised, 10-round bout at Chicago Stadium and may get an early summer crack at the crown if he wins.

One of Wednesday night's more interested spectators at ringside will be middleweight champion Gene Fullmer, who is in training in Chicago for his title defense in a rematch with Sugar Ray Robinson at the Stadium May 1.

Webb, who like Sandy, is 25 years old, has lost only once in 22 pro starts after a fine amateur career that included winning the NCAA 156-pound championship while at Idaho State College and representing the United States on the 1952 Olympic boxing team at Helsinki.

His lone defeat came in 1953 in a six-rounder with Red Elby, now retired.

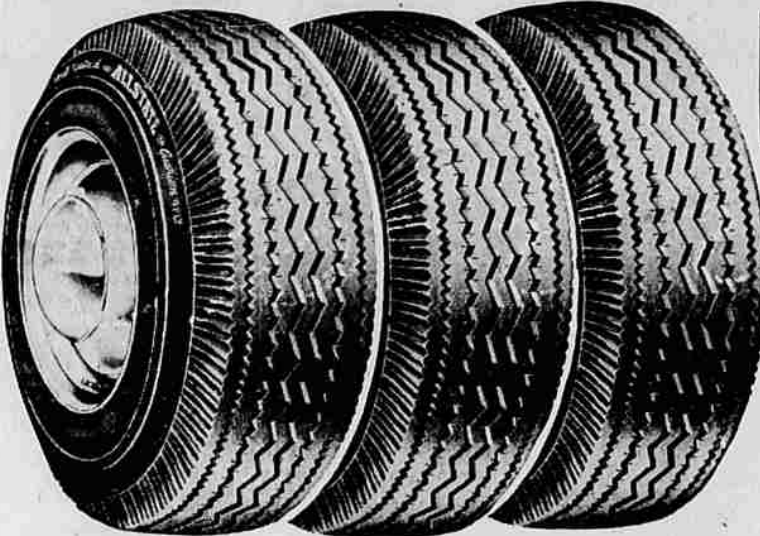

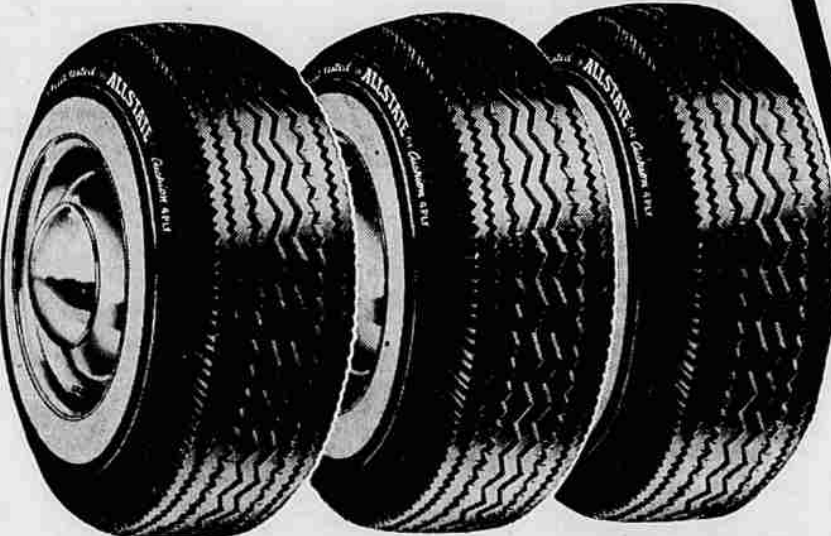
