Louise Rainer Turned On Charm for Keavy

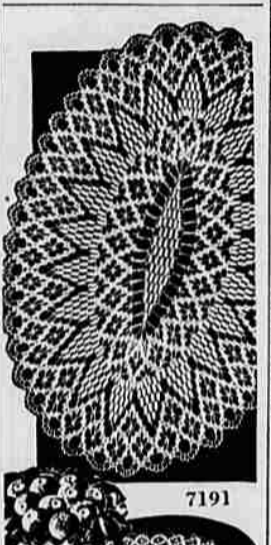

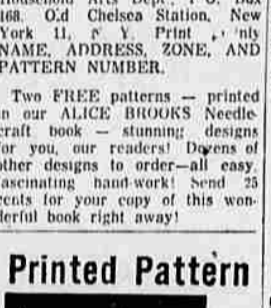
