

HOUSTON THREATENED

Storms Still Flood Texas; Deaths at 11

DALLAS (AP)—Hail and thunderstorms battered storm-weary Texas from the Panhandle to the Rio Grande yesterday threatening new floods.

The rains continued today along the Gulf and in south and west Texas.

Two persons drowned at Dallas yesterday and a Mexican couple were killed by lightning at Nuevo Laredo, across the Rio Grande from Laredo.

Others Die in Wrecks At least 11 drownings have been blamed on the floods since the violent weather started April 18.

The surging Trinity River threatened to spill over its banks in the Houston area. The Trinity passed the 26-foot mark yesterday at Liberty, Tex., 40 miles north-west of Houston, two feet above flood stage.

It was expected to reach 28 feet before it stops rising, which may flood residential areas in Liberty.

The Brazos River also was on the rampage and flooding in the entire area surrounding Houston was expected within the next two days.

The Department of Public Safety said nine major rivers were flooding after the torrential rains in the state the past 10 days.

A total of 83 highways were closed and hundreds of bridges were washed out.

Six Feet Above Flood Stage The Sabine River on the eastern boundary of the state has been six feet above flood stage in its upper branches near Mineola and Gladewater and another six-foot rise was expected early this week.

The swollen Colorado was expected to crest at 32 to 35 feet at Wharton and Bay City today.

The crest at Wharton would be higher than the flood of June 1941. Flood warnings were issued for Gonzales, Cuero and Meyersville in central south Texas as the Guadalupe continued to rise.

The Nueces and Frio rivers, also in south Texas, flooded lowlands along their banks.

The Rio Grande, Pecos and Devils River were being watched closely in the junction area.

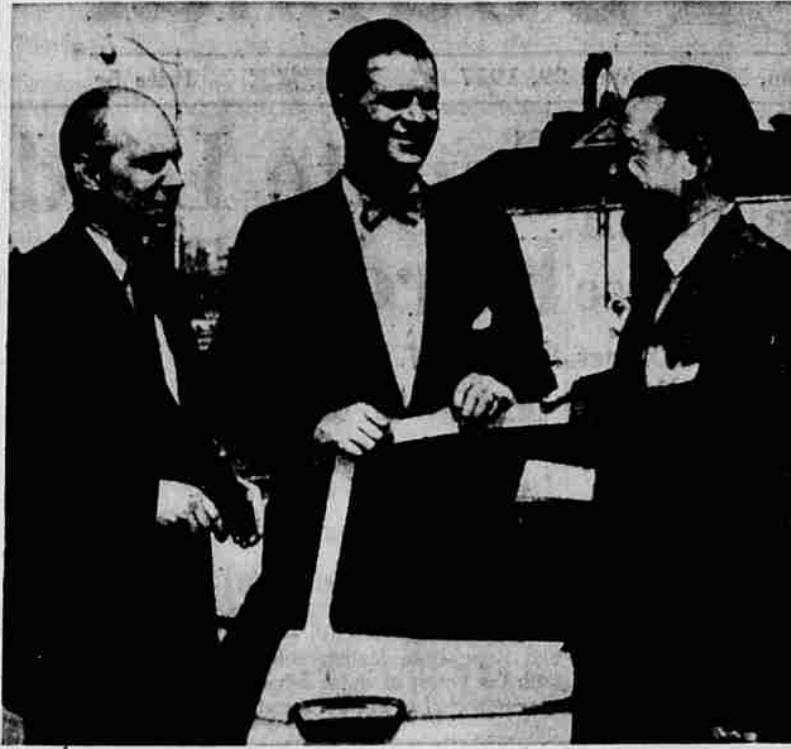
Streams feeding into the Rio Grande have washed out railroad tracks and highways in the Laredo area along the Mexican border.

Burris Lee Goodwin, 22, drowned yesterday in the Trinity. He was swept into the river as dozens watched in horror.

C. R. Seymour of Ropesville has been missing on Lake Diversion, near Wichita Falls, since last Friday.

Deliver the Goods, 'Soapy' Tells Demos

PORTLAND (UP)—Gov. G. Mennen Williams of Michigan told Multnomah county Democrats Sunday that achievement of power by their party demanded also the assumption of responsibility.

The youthful governor, who has been mentioned as a candidate for the Democratic nomination for President in 1960, highly praised Oregon Democrats for the "tremendous job" they have done in recent years.

"Now you have to deliver the goods," Williams said. "The people should have a larger slice of the good things in life."

Williams lauded Sen. Wayne Morse as a man "we all have tremendous confidence in."

Williams spoke in Medford Saturday night at the annual Roosevelt Memorial dinner.

He said the Democratic party must "recognize the new challenges and meet them with new ideas. That is what Franklin Roosevelt would be doing if he were with us today."

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Michigan's Democratic Gov. G. Mennen Williams, in California for a two-day series of speeches, said he was "tired of Eisenhower normalcy and drifting."

Williams told reporters "the people want to start doing things" as he arrived by airplane Sunday night from Portland.

"I think the people want something done about the big money items in all state budgets—highways, education and mental health."

"The Democrats," he continued, "are the ones who have the programs on these problems and stick to them because they want to give all the people a better life."

Williams said "the administration's foreign policy depends on who's talking. Eisenhower says one thing, Dulles another, and your own Sen. Knowland (R-Calif) has his own ideas."

"What is needed is a general review of the world situation to evolve some way for the nations of the earth to build economic and political stability. A firm basis for peace must include a policy of justice and self-determination of peoples—an item on which Secretary of State Dulles has been vacillating," he declared.

Kennedy Says Probe Unit Can Prove \$320,000 Theft by Beck

By HERBERT FOSTER United Press Staff Correspondent WASHINGTON (UP)—The Senate Rackets Committee has a "good deal more" information on Teamster Union chief Dave Beck, committee counsel Robert Kennedy said Sunday night.

Kennedy also expressed confidence the committee could prove that Beck stole \$320,000 in Teamster funds.

Kennedy, appearing on the NBC-TV program "Meet The Press," was asked if the committee could "prove in a court of law" its accusation that Beck "took" \$320,000 in Teamster funds for his own use.

"I think that without question we could prove that Mr. Beck stole the \$320,000," replied Kennedy.

Lot More Information He said the committee has a lot more information on Beck than disclosed in previous hearings and said the Teamster chief will be given "an opportunity to come in and refute" the data "if he wants to."

Kennedy said the new matter involves companies in which Beck "had a financial interest that have dealings with the Teamsters Union."

He said the "information that we will develop" will be of interest to the AFL-CIO Ethical Practices Committee, which is already considering Beck's case, as well as to the labor movement as a whole and the public.

The rackets committee scheduled a public hearing this afternoon to give Earl P. Bettendorf, a Texarkana, Tex., businessman, a chance to explain why he was not indicted along with two Teamster Union leaders accused of accepting money from him.

Texas Not Indicted Bettendorf asked to appear after committee chairman John L. McClellan (D-Ark.) said the committee would ask the Justice Department why the Texan was not indicted.

Teamster Union business agents Joseph McHugh and Robert Malloy of Scranton, Pa., are under federal indictment for extorting \$4,200 from Bettendorf.

The committee pressed a search for four long-missing witnesses in its investigation of Beck and his Teamster Union. They are Beck's son, two of Beck's wife's relatives and a Teamster Union auditor.

Kennedy said the son and two relatives are wanted for questioning because they hold "prominent roles in certain companies that have had financial dealings" with the Teamsters.

High GOP Rumor 5 Said About to Quit Ike Cabinet

WASHINGTON (UP)—Five members of President Eisenhower's cabinet may resign soon, according to informed GOP circles.

Secretary of Defense Charles E. Wilson and Treasury Secretary George M. Humphrey, previously have been reported ready to return to private life.

The GOP circles said the three other cabinet members who may leave are Secretary of State John Foster Dulles, Secretary of Commerce Sinclair Weeks and Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield.

Wilson and Humphrey were expected to stay on until after the outcome of the congressional fights over appropriations, defense and taxes.

Wilson's resignation has been rumored, and denied, for months. Reports that Humphrey is leaving sprang up again last week and the Treasury secretary himself dropped a strong hint that he plans to resign soon.

Humphrey said it was well known that he had "been in the cabinet much longer than I originally planned."

Three names have been mentioned as possible replacements for Humphrey: They are Robert B. Anderson, a Texas Eisenhower Democrat and former deputy defense secretary; Undersecretary of Treasury W. Randolph Burgess, and Lewis W. Douglas, former ambassador to Britain and one-time budget director under President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Should Dulles leave, Undersecretary of State Christian A. Herter, former governor of Massachusetts, would be a likely successor.

35 Tried for Looting Mussolini's Fortune

PADUA, Italy (UP)—Thirty-five persons, most of them former Communist guerrillas, went on trial here today on charges of murder, looting and embezzlement arising from the theft of Benito Mussolini's \$500,000 fortune.

Only 34 defendants were present in court. The 35th, Communist legislator Dante Gorreri, has been a fugitive from justice for four years.

The trial is expected to last four to five months. More than 200 witnesses are scheduled to appear, including Mussolini's widow, three of his children and the sister of his murdered mistress.

The Fascist dictator and his mistress, Claretta Petacci, were killed in nearby Dongo 12 years ago Sunday by Red guerrillas who ambushed the German convoy that was trying to smuggle them out of the country.

No one is certain what became of the "Dongo treasure"—some \$61,000 worth of gold and more than \$800,000 in Italian, British, Spanish and Swiss currency that Mussolini was carrying with him.

A number of persons who apparently "knew too much" about the theft have been murdered in the years since the Mussolini fortune vanished.
