

Driving Course Available

There will be a defensive driving course offered here at Warm Springs on April 5, 12, 19, & 26, 1976. This will be given by Lee Loomis, the time schedule is from 1:30-3:30 p.m. and 7:00-9:00 p.m.

This is for any interested person that would like to improve his (her) driving skills, also for traffic offenders that are on probation, and driving while under the influence of alcohol.

Driving while suspended or revoked; a persons commits the crime of driving while suspended or revoked if he drives a motor vehilce on a highway during the period when his license or permit to drive, or right to apply for license has been suspended.

There are some acceptances as in subsection (2) paragraph (b) The defendant had not received notice of suspension-revocation as required by ORS 482.570 or in the manner provided in paragraph (c) of sub. section (3) in this sec.

(3) The affirmative defense under paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of this section shall not be available to the defendant if; (a) the defendant refused to sign a receipt for the

certified mail containing the notice. (b) The notice could not be delivered to the defendant because he had not notified the division of a change in his residence as required by subsection (2) of ORS 482.290 or; (c) at a previous court appearance, the defendant had been informed by a trial judge that the judge was ordering a suspension of the defendants license, permit or right to apply.

(4) Any of the evidence specified in subsection (3) of this section may be offered in the prosecutions case in chief.

(5) DRIVING WHILE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED IS A CLASS C FELONY, if the suspension or revocation was the result of conviction for any of the following offenses: (a) Manslaughter or Criminally negligent homicide resulting from the operation of a motor vehicle. (b) Any crime punishable as a felony in the commission of which a motor vehicle was used. (c) Failure to perform the duties of a driver involved in an accident or collision which results in physical injury to any person, (d) Dangerous driving in the first or second degree, (e) Fleeing or attempting to elude

a police officer (f) Driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, dangerous drugs or narcotic drugs. (g) Reckless driving.

Any offender can receive a severe penalty.

Teen Boys Champs

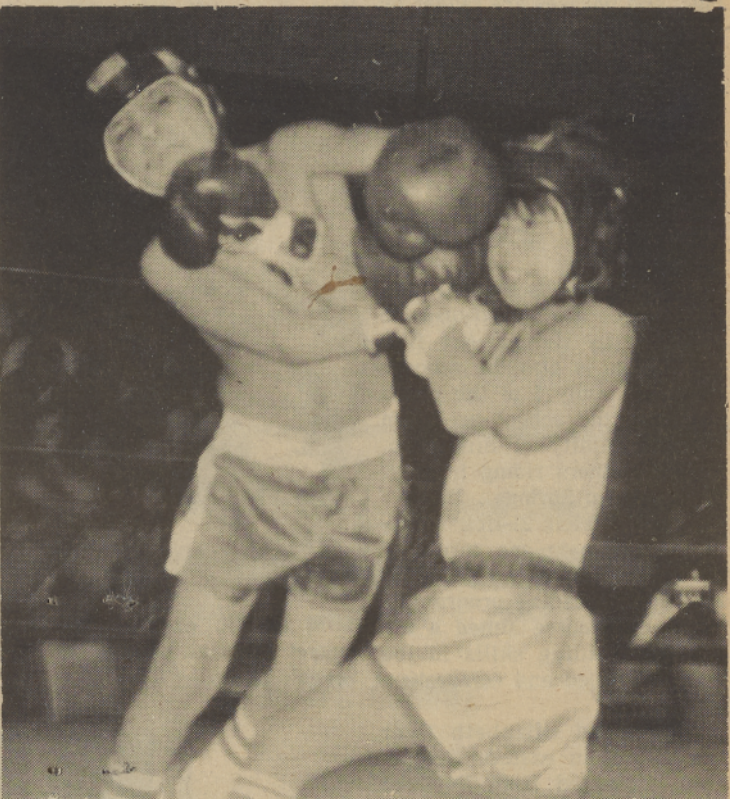
The Warm Springs teen basketball team won the tournament that was held on the week-end of March 27-28th, here at the Community Center.

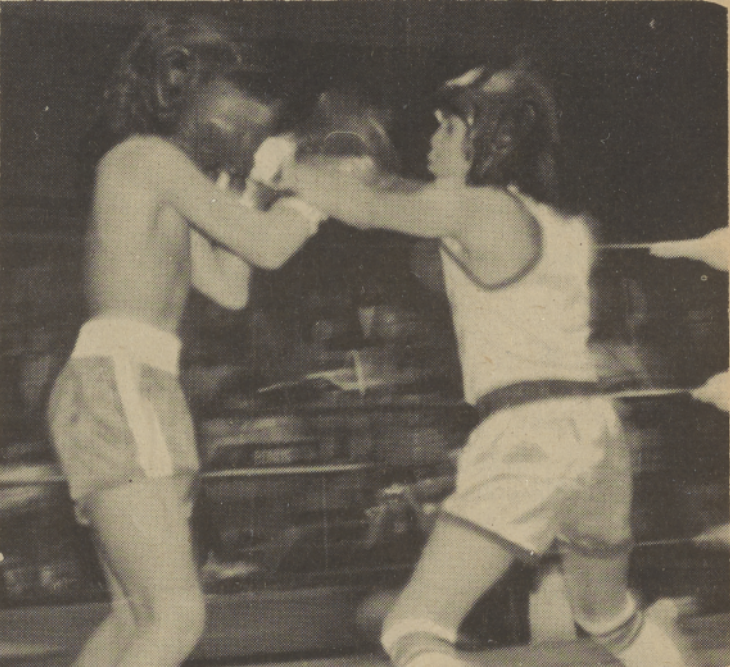

WSRA Prepares For Rodeo

Members of the Warm Springs Rodeo association are busy working on the rodeo arena in preparation for the upcoming annual root feast rodeo.

There were extensive damages done to the holding pens behind the chutes. Also under construction is a perimeter fence at the rodeo arena to control the parking. This will eliminate the parking on the hill behind the bleachers, and also will help the W.S.R.A. to collect gate receipts. The gate receipts will help with the expenses of

the rodeo. This will pay for special features, area labor and regular overhead during the rodeo.

These jobs have to be completed before the rodeo stock can be moved in.

According to spokesman for the W.S.R.A. there should be a good turn out of the Northwests better cowboys. The W.S.R.A. is planning on at least 3 rodeo's here this year; the root feast rodeo, the pi-um-sha day's held in June each year, and the Huckleberry feast rodeo in August.
