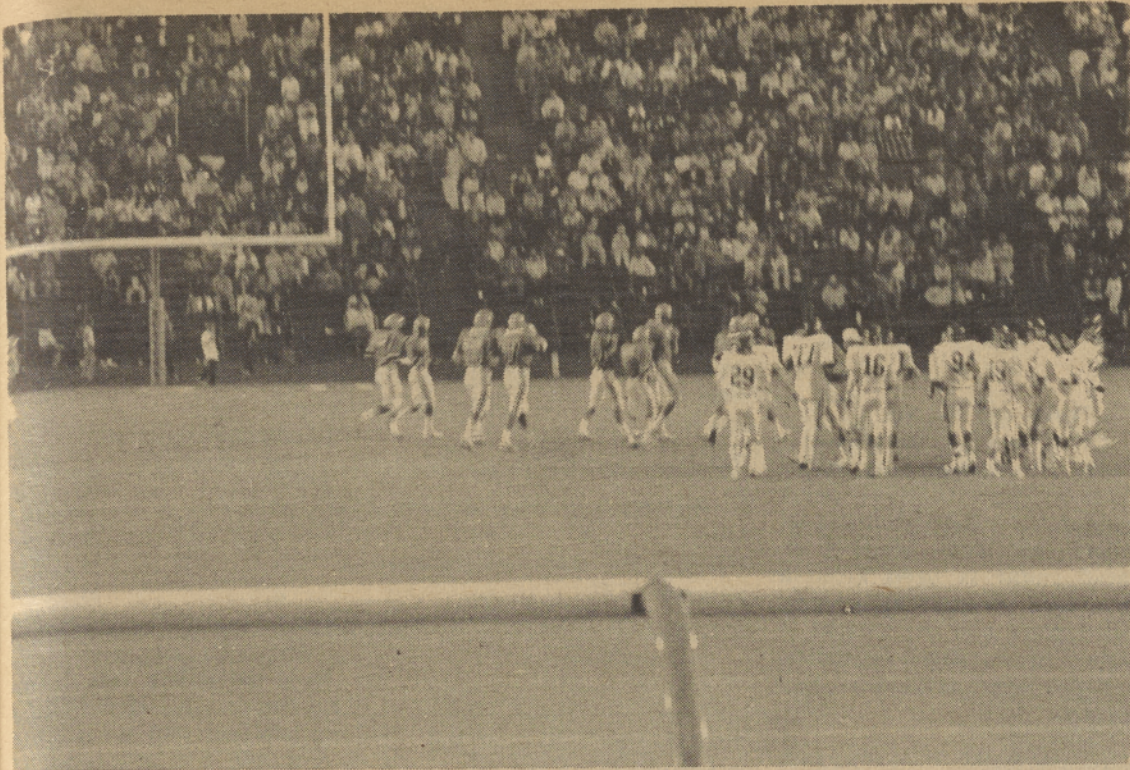




THE BEAVER-JAYHAWK game in Parker Stadium.

'Miami Dolphin star quarterback, Bob Griese, and Lisa Cagle, the Muscular Dystrophy Association's National Poster Child, have teamed up to help fight muscular dystrophy and related disorders.

Lisa is MDA's lively, young, good-will ambassador. She has a six-year-old's enthusiastic love for music, dolls, animals and family picnics. Four years ago, Lisa was diagnosed as having Werdnig-Hoffman disease, a type of spinal muscular atrophy. The disease is one of a large number of neuromuscular disorders which, in addition to muscular dystrophy, are covered by MDA's programs.

Griese is MDA's National Sports Chairman, and leads a Committee of star athletes backing MDA's fund-raising efforts.

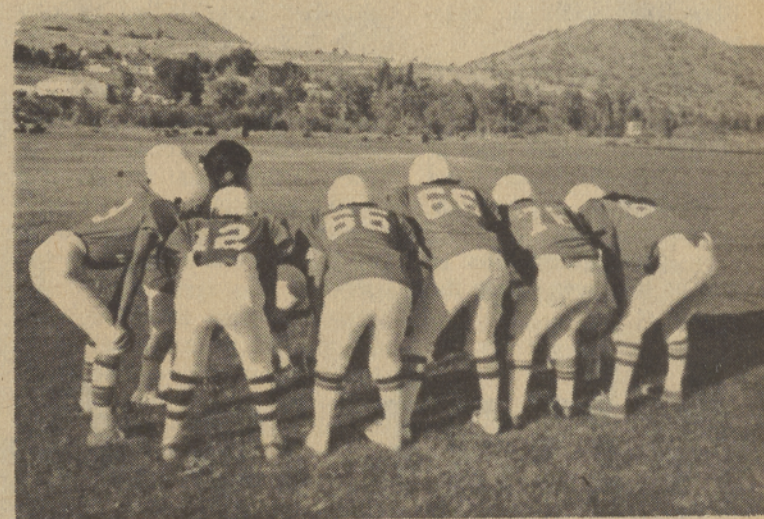

WSRA Standings

These standings are as of August 15th which includes the results of the Ft. Hall rodeo. So at this time everything may be altogether different, so don't panic. The above only includes the top ten contenders in each event.

So there are no local cowboys in the all-around standings, however, there are two boys leading individual events and they are Joe Scott

in the saddle bronc with a total of \$1,348.94, which is \$93.28 ahead of the second place cowboy in that event. Scott has also been competing and placing the professional rodeos throughout the country. Participating in the pro shows sometimes prevents him from competing in the W.S.I.R.A. shows to maintain his lead.

In the bareback Leland Tom is ahead in that event

with a total of \$1,156.69, which is \$59.48 over the second place cowboy in that event.

In the bull riding Larry Squiemphen is sitting 4th with a total of \$744.02, and Phillip Winnier is in 6th place.

In the girls barrel race Priscilla Squiemphen is in 3rd place, Marita Johnson is 4th, and Sammi Squiemphen is in 10th place. At this time these standings may be all changed.

Bowling League underway
