In the high three games individually, George Clements

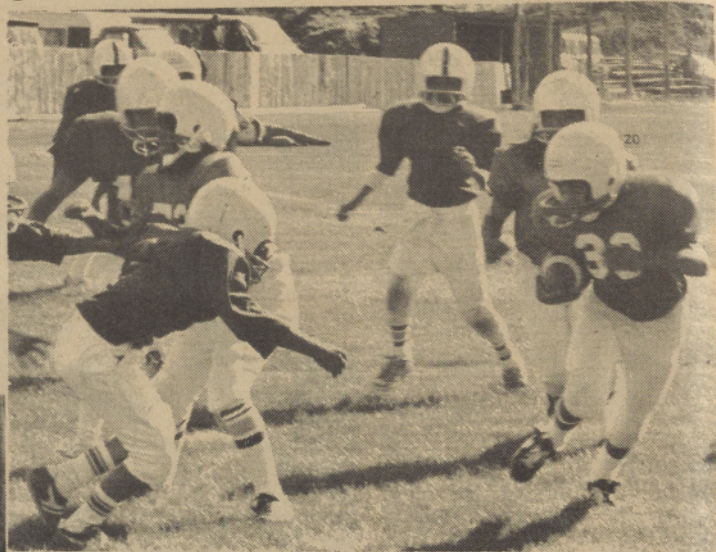
had a total of 580, Gerald Nicodemus had 568 and Dick Souers had 564.

The boys done real well and a much improved team from their opener a week earlier. The final score was Warm Springs 22 Yakima 0.
