## ● Lots of treats

Halloween was celebrated a day early in Warm Springs but there was as much enthusiasm as ever. Throngs of kids descended on the populated areas of the campus and West Hills, and hurried from house to house with open bags as waiting cars filled the streets.

The evening was accented by a carnival, contests and a movie at the Community Center, for which an estimated 300 kids and adults turned out.

According to Police Chief Jeff Sanders there were no reports of vandalism through the Halloween weekend.

This was the first year for the carnival and the number of game booths is expected to increase for future carnivals. Sponsoring booths and concessions this year were the Fourth of July Committee, the Bravettes, the Warm Springs Athletic Association, the Madras High Indian Club, the Head Start-Day Care Parents' Club and Stenopool.

The Community Center sponsored the Haunted House for which the Mill supplied the lumber.

Costume judging was a popular event, with dozens of miniature witches, clowns, hobos and monsters vying for prizes. Decorated pumpkins and cakes were judged earlier in the day and displayed that evening.

The film "Island at the Top of the World" drew about 100 people and Bingo kept the adults occupied for hours.

Co-ordinator Eva Montee was pleased with the public's response to the Community Center events and hopes for an expanded carnival next year.
