Open Letter to Tribal Council

It has been a major problem every since I've been taking my child to Day Care, which is 4 years, and who knows how much longer before then - of them having to close Day Care because there is no heat, no water, or at times - both!

This causes a lot of problems for many of us who utilize Day Care, I've seen many departments (including the one I work in) having to let their workers off these particular days because Day Care closes, and believe me - it's a problem trying to find a sitter even for just that one day!!

It may not seem much of a concern or problem to you, but for those of us who do utilize the facility, it's quite a big problem.

Not only does it cause problems of finding a baby sitter for that day, but a day missed from work if your not one of the lucky one's to find a sitter. Time the worker has to take off their job, when possibly some of the Day Care workers can utilize their home to take care of some of the children when they are getting paid for that day anyway!

But a better suggestion would be for you to take into more consideration, planning and sincere discussion of getting a new Day Care facility built. Even if it means getting tribal monies, EDA grants, etc., to get the facility built, I'm sure if it has to go to referendum, the people would vote to put tribal monies out for a most needed facility.

To us working mothers this would be a most needed facility, and most appreciated if taken care of now, not in the future say 5-10 years from now. Concentrate more on this need rather than an information center, shopping center, etc., etc. We realize these other items are needed in our community, but to us working mothers - a Day Care facility is much more important!!

COST OF WINTER FEEDING

Winter feeding is costly and yet it's one of the most important things you can do for the health of your cattle. Health also determines weight on calves and number of calves winter feeding should be balanced to provide protein minerals, vitamins and energy. Poorly fed cattle will lose weight and be too thin to produce milk for a fast growing calf. What you feed is important in determining the costs. For instance feed all alfalfa hay at 25 lbs a day will cost 86 cents per day. But you can still have balanced rations but lower the feed cost by

feeding 23 lbs. grass hay and 1½-2 lbs. protein supplement for 45 cents per day.
