(Age and Weight)

BANTAM DIVISIONS: Starting with 8 to 9 year olds; 45 lbs., with 5 lb. graduations.

JUNIOR DIVISIONS: Starting with 10 and 11 year olds; 60 lbs., with 5 lb. graduations.

INTERMEDIATE DIVISIONS: Starting with 12 and 13 year olds; 70 lbs., with 5 lb. graduations.

SENIOR DIVISIONS: Starting with 14 and 15 year olds; 80 lbs., with 5 lb. graduations.

SPECIAL SENIOR: Starting with 16-19 year olds; Starting with 20 year olds and up.

Length of rounds according to Junior Olympic and Oregon AAU Boxing Rules the following applies:

8-9, 10-11 year olds box one minute rounds.

12-13 year olds box one and one-half minute rounds.

14-15 year olds box two minute rounds.

The Warm Springs Boxing Club announces the All-Indian Novice - Sub-Novice boxing Championships to be held December 18 and 19 at the Community Center. Sanctioned by the Oregon Athletic Association and co-sponsored by the Warm Springs Community Center, the bouts will include four age divisions for 8 to 15 year olds and a special senior division for 19 and up.

Eliminations will take place Saturday afternoon and evening, to which the public is invited.

The schedule and regulations are as follows:

Weigh In 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. (Saturday, December 18).

Physicals 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Draw 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

Saturday afternoon eliminations from 1:00 p.m. to approximately 6:00 p.m.

Saturday evening eliminations from 7:00 p.m. to approximately 10:30 p.m.

Number of entries per club unlimited.

Entry fee is \$1.00 per boy. No expenses.

Overnight: Youngsters may sleep overnight in the gym. Bring your own sleeping bag.

There must be adult supervision in the gym from those clubs that stay there.

Physical examination card must be presented to doctors at time of weigh-in.

AAU cards must be presented to the clerk at time of weigh-in.

Last Wednesday, December 1st, John Wright of Madras who bowls with the Burger Inn team, amazed other members of the Warm Springs League by rolling the second highest series ever at Pelton Lanes. He turned in a 770 series!
