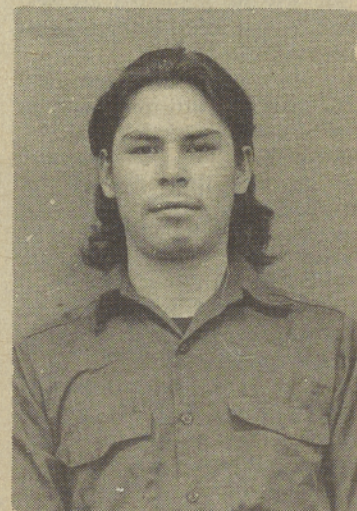

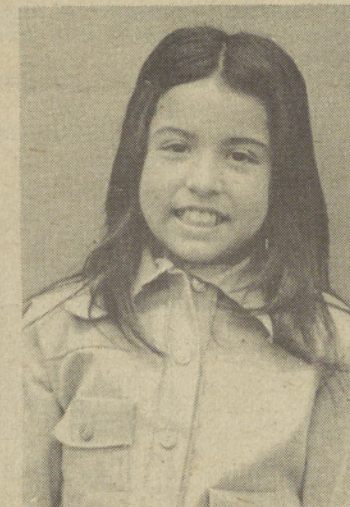
LONNY DEAN MACY

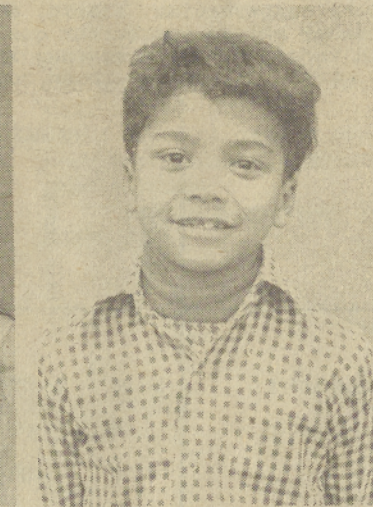


LAURA (MISSY) STILL

DANIEL MARTINEZ

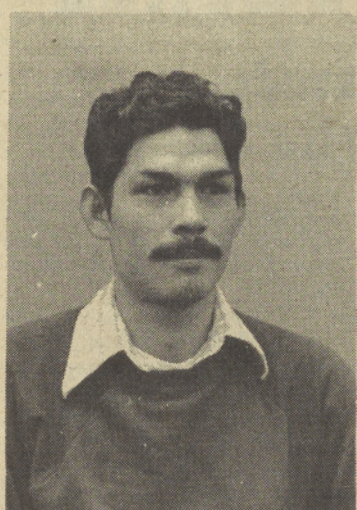
Born May 27, 1953. Age 23. Indian blood degree - 7-16.
