WASHINGTON, D.C.—Oregon Congressman Al Ullman today announced a series of personnel changes affecting the staffs of his Congressional office and the House Committee on Ways and Means.

Ullman said he has named Bill Robertson Administrative Assistant in his Congressional office. Robertson replaces Bill Alberger who has been appointed Administrative Assistant on the staff of the Ways and Means Committee. Both changes are effective immediately. Robertson, 29, will assist

Ullman in directing the day-to-day operations of his Congressional offices in Washington, D.C., and Oregon. He has been Ullman's Executive Assistant for the past 14 months. Prior to that, he served under Ullman on the staff of the House Committee on the Budget and worked for the Oregon Journal.

Alberger, 31, will work with Ullman and the Ways and Means Chief Counsel John Martin on several aspects of Committee management and procedures. He has been on Ullman's Congressional staff

for five years — the last two as Administrative Assistant.

Ullman also announced the addition of Jim Beall and Ed Grosswiler to his Congressional office staff. Beall, 27, is serving as Legislative assistant. Previously he worked as an attorney for the U.S. Interior Department.

Grosswiler, 34, has been appointed Press Secretary, effective March 21. He is a long-time Oregon newsman, working for the Associated Press in Salem and Portland for 14 years.
