

# YCC offers outdoor work to youth

Youth are again being given the chance to learn, work and earn money while enjoying the fresh air.

Applications are being accepted for this summer's YCC program, says BIA Education Specialist Marlin Reimer. The

YCC, or Youth Conservation Corps, is open to boys and girls between the ages of 15 and 18 who would like an active employment and education opportunity.

The program begins June 20 and continues to August 12.

Twenty-four young people will be selected to participate in outdoor conservation projects on a forty-hour a week basis. Youth will be paid for thirty hours at the minimum wage, and will spend ten hours in environmental awareness activities.

YCC was established under the Department of Interior and Department of Agriculture to fulfill three main objectives. They are to provide gainful employment for 15-18 year olds from all social and economic backgrounds, to develop and maintain the natural resources of the U.S. through conservation work on public lands, and to promote understanding and appreciation on the part of youth for their natural environment and heritage.

Local coordinators for YCC are Bud Raisio at the high school, and Marlin Reimer (553-1121, ext. 55). They encourage early applications and are happy to answer questions about the program.

## Child found in Kah-Nee-Ta Pool

The opening of Kah-Nee-Ta's busy season was marred by the accidental death of a 3½ year old guest on Thursday March 24. Chad Allen Burris was found in the Lodge pool around 9:30 a.m. soon after his sister reported him missing.

Maintenance man Frank Greeninger pulled the boy out of the pool and stayed with

him until more help arrived. Two Emergency Medical Technicians on the Kah-Nee-Ta staff—Bond Harmon and Grant Lyons—administered mouth-to-mouth resuscitation but to no avail.

Chad had been vacationing with his two sisters and grandmother when the accident occurred.

# 1977 Fishing Regulations

1977 FISHING REGULATIONS OF THE WARM SPRINGS INDIAN RESERVATION:

1. VISITOR'S FISHING AREAS. Visitors may fish in the following described open areas of the Warm Springs Indian Reservation in accordance with these regulations and provided that all persons shall have a copy of these regulations in their possession while fishing. (a) Area 1. High Cascade Mountain Lakes,; Trout Lake, Long Lake, Island Lake, Dark Lake, Boulder Lake, Harvey Lake and Blue Lake. Except for lakes within Area 6, no other lakes are open to public fishing. Open April 23, 1977 to October 31. The use of motor boats on these lakes is prohibited.

Area 2. Deschutes River-From the mouth of Dry

Creek north a distance of approximately six miles to the Wasco-Jefferson County Line. Open April 23, to October 31, 1977.

Area 3. Warm Springs River—From Indian Head Canyon Bridge east to the designated marker at the east end of Kah-Nee-Ta Resort and opens April 16, to October 31.

Area 4. Lake Simtustus - Open April 23, to Oct. 31. Fishing from boats with or without motor is permitted on Lake Simtustus. Boats are prohibited from landing on the Reservation side of Lake Simtustus except at Indian Park.

Area 5. Metolius Arm and Deschutes Arm of Lake Billy Chinook where it borders on the Reservation. No camping or fires will be permitted on Chinook Island. Use of Chin-

ook Island shall be permitted only upon payment of daily use fee.

Area 6. McQuinn Strip - Fishing is permitted in the lakes and streams of the McQuinn Strip as defined in Public Law 92-427, 92nd Congress, and as shown on the accompanying map.

ALL RESERVATION WATERS NOT LISTED ABOVE ARE CLOSED TO FISHING BY VISITORS. These include Mary Lake, Hazel Lake, Alice Lake, Marie Lake, Lilda Lake, Sarah Lake, Francis Lake, and Happy Valley Reservoir. All of Beaver Creek, Mill Creek, Badger Creek, Boulder Creek, Shitike Creek, Metolius River, Whitewater River, and Seekseequa Creek; and those portions of the Deschutes River and Warm Springs River not described above.

Travel to Visitor's Fish-

ing area 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 will be allowed only on those roads designated as open to provide access to the lakes, streams, and camp grounds as shown on the map.

(b) PERMITS AND FEES Season Visitor's Fishing permit \$8.00, and is valid in all areas except 6.

Daily visitor's fishing permit in areas 1 and 2. All persons must have a permit to fish regardless of age, at the cost of \$1.00. Area 3. Warm Springs River. This permit can only be obtained by registered guests at Kah-Nee-Ta Resort. All persons must have a permit required in areas 4, 5. Only one permit will be required for a family. A family is defined as a husband and wife and children under 14 years of age. The cost is \$1.50.

Area 6. McQuinn Strip. No additional written permit required. Visitor's Fishing permits for areas 1, 2, 4, and 5 may be procured from the Warm Springs Tribal office or any appointed agent. Permits for area 3, may be procured only from the Kah-Nee-Ta Resort.

2. Fishing from or having assembled fishing tackle in or on any boat or other floating device on the Deschutes, Warm Springs or Metolius Rivers is prohibited.

3. Camping and fires will be permitted only at the designated campgrounds at Indian Park on Lake Simtustus, Blue Lake, Trout Lake, Dry Creek and Kah-Nee-Ta Resort upon payment of designated fee; also Brietenbush and Bear Springs campgrounds within the McQuinn Strip. No camping will be permitted for more than ten (10) consecutive days except at Kah-Nee-Ta Resort where there is no limit on length of stay. Camping fees and day use fees will be designated at each campground. Campers must have as part of their equipment, an axe, a shovel, and a water pail. Fires must be confined to fireplaces under the grates.

A severe penalty shall be imposed on any violators of the articles as set forth in these regulations.

It is also advised that each visitor read thoroughly the 1977 fishing regulations as the publication in this paper was condensed considerably.

## Girl struck by pick-up

First grader Evelyn Gilbert was injured Thursday afternoon March 30 when she ran into the street by the campus school bus stop and into the path of an oncoming pick-up.

Evelyn, whose mother is the cook at the Simnasho school, was taken to the Indian Health Service clinic by ambulance attendants Vicki Still and Bob Tom. The Madras Elementary student was treated and released.

According to Police Chief Jeff Sanders, the driver of the pick-up, Priscilla Squiemphen, did not have enough time to stop when the child suddenly ran out in front of her. No further action is being contemplated by the police department.

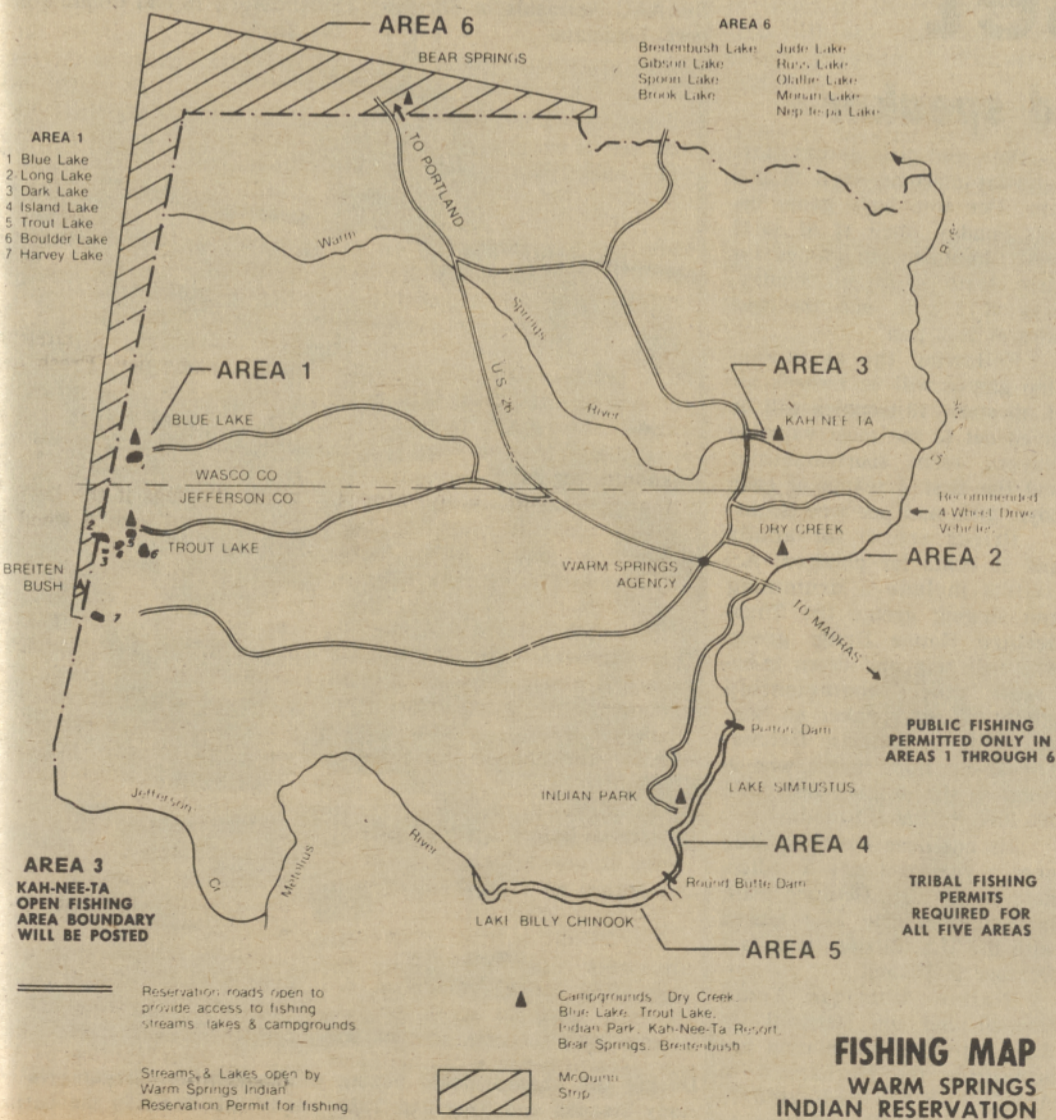
