

## Extension Notes:

### How To Satisfy Your Child's Curiosity

"Why is the grass green?" "What are stars?" "Why can't I fly?" Your small questioner may try your patience until you are tempted to say, "Don't ask so many questions!" or "Just because!"

Most children are avid questioners who use questions for a variety of purposes. Although a child's questioning may be exhausting, it is good and natural. It is an important learning activity for them and gives parents insight into their thoughts.

Seeking information through questioning is part of a child's development. Beginning with infancy, children need various kinds of interesting, stimulating, and pleasurable experiences to become intellectually motivated and alert.

The questioning, curious child is saying, "It's a big and interesting world that I am finding out about." And you are their helper.

Curiosity is a valuable trait which needs to be respected. Some parents are stumped by questions even preschoolers ask.

Searching for answers in books or asking others shows

children how unknown information is found. When you find the answer, it can be translated into language the child can understand.

Children frequently ask questions to help sort out their own thoughts.

Parents who turn the question back to the child saying, "That's a good question, what do you think?" may find the child already has a good idea and wants to explore it. It provides them an opportunity to stretch their thinking.

Occasionally questions are used to get and keep attention of another person. Or they may be used as part of a stalling technique by preschoolers. Asking questions is a way of sorting out feelings and may give you clues about worries of the child.

Asking, "How did you happen to think about this?" will often let you know what is in the child's mind and give you a better basis for answering the question.

When you are exhausted by questions, help the youngster get involved in some activity to give yourself a rest and build up your patience for the next go round.

### OSU Mini-College Has Something For Every Homemaker
