The Eighth Annual Fundaze Invitational Softball Tournament is over, and the Eugene Chic's showed their fine quality to play by winning the first place trophy.

The perpetual trophy must be won three times before a team can take it home. Lake Oswego won it the last two years, but was unable to make it this year.

When asked what led his team to victory, Coach Revelle replied, "It was obviously our pitching, we never pitched this good a game." But in an earlier game against Eugene, the coach for Lebanon said, "The pitcher for Eugene chokes up in a full count situation."

The championship game, played between Eugene and Medford Taco Bells, was dedicated to Jake Wacker, who was coach of Junction City and passed away last month. Aurolyn Stwyer, reigning Miss Warm Springs and center field for the Warm Springs Bravettes presented a beautiful

The first game of the championship series was won by Medford, 3-1, in front of a crowd of about 200 people. A player for Medford remarked, "We won because of our defense, we held them from scoring, and made very few errors." A spectator was slightly mad because Eugene lost the first game. He showed this when he said, "the umpires were just cheating for Medford." The umpires were Doyle Whipple of Madras, and Lyle Thomas of Bend.

In the final game, Eugene outscored Medford 9-1 to take the championship.

The Warm Springs Bravettes didn't play too well, but they won their first game against McMinnville 9-3.

In their games, the Bravettes lost to Hillsboro, 7-0, and then to Medford 3-1. Coach of the Bravettes, Vernon Tanewasha said, "we never got started right away in the first three innings, and we never hit

the ball." It was no shame to lose to Hillsboro though, because they were Oregon State Champs last year, and took fourth in the Nation.
