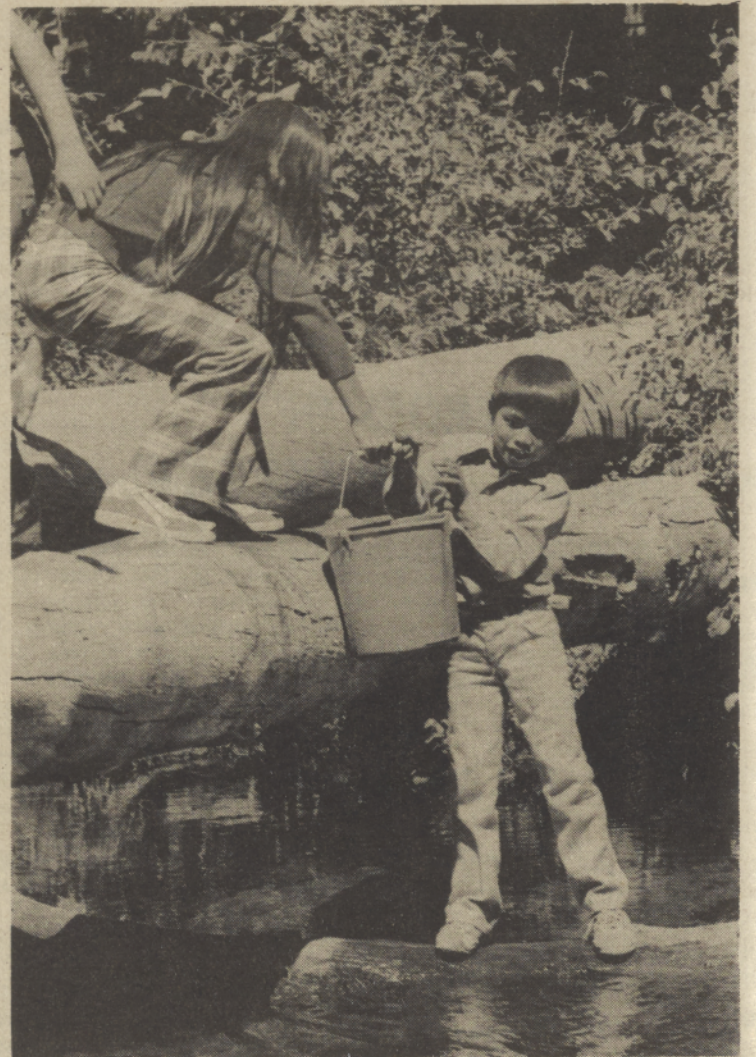


Culture Camp At Peter's Pasture
