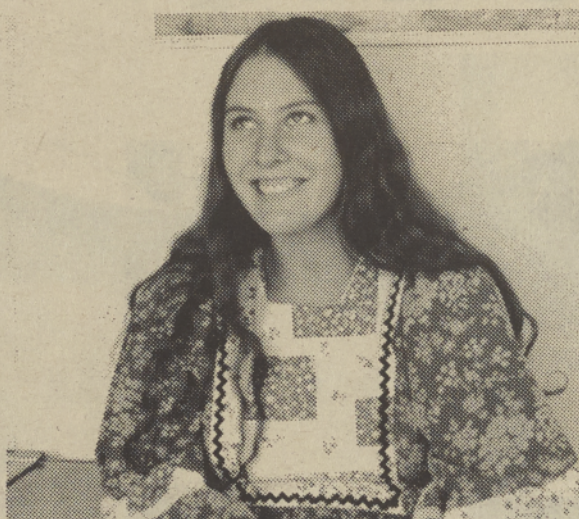


The Gang That Keeps Them Rolling
