in death by her mother Vena Keo Jacobs in 1975. Also surviving are her grandparents Isabello Keo and Elvina Switzler of Warm Springs.

Dressing ceremonies were held February 21 a Madras Evergreen Chapel with S.A. McKinley officiating. Overnight ceremonies were at Simnasho Longhouse, with Matilda Mitchell and Herb Stwyer officiating. Burial was at Simnasho Cemetery.

JEREMIAH JAMES LEWIS - was born December 1, 1977 in Pendleton and died February 18, 1978 at Madras.

A Bit Of History . . . Iwo Jima . .

Would you believe it was thirty-three years ago the U.S. Marines were fighting courageously for the small island of Iwo Jima, a formation of stone, volcanic ash and sand structure.

The enemy of 23,000 strong made their vow that they would kill 10 marines each before being killed themselves as the big U.S. assault started with the landing of troops on February 19, 1945. And it wasn't until March 26, that the island was officially declared captured by the U.S.A.

By taking this island the American took a giant step in shortening WW II. Even though this was costly in casualties this prevented the Japanese from bombing other American-held bases such as the Marianas and also prevented the Japanese from intercepting B-29 bombers on their way to the Japanese mainland.

It was in June and July 1944 when carriers first started air attacks and heavy naval bombardments of Iwo Jima, and the final assault didn't come until

months later.

The Japanese were well fortified with caves, underground tunnels and bunkers that gave the Marines stiff resistance. The Marine offensive consisted of troops from the 4th and 5th marine divisions, all veterans of previous island battles further in the south pacific. The 3rd division joined a day or two later.

On historic February 23, a reinforced Marine platoon fought their way to the top of Mount Suribachi and raised the American flag. After about three hours of mop-up on Mount Suribachi, a larger flag was brought up to replace the first one and the famed photo of the Iwo Jima flag-raising took place.

After about a month's fighting the island was secured, but the total number of Marine casualties rose as high as 25,000. Back in the minds of all Indians reflects the memory of Ira Hayes, the famous Indian Marine, one of three survivors from the flag raising group on Iwo Jima.
