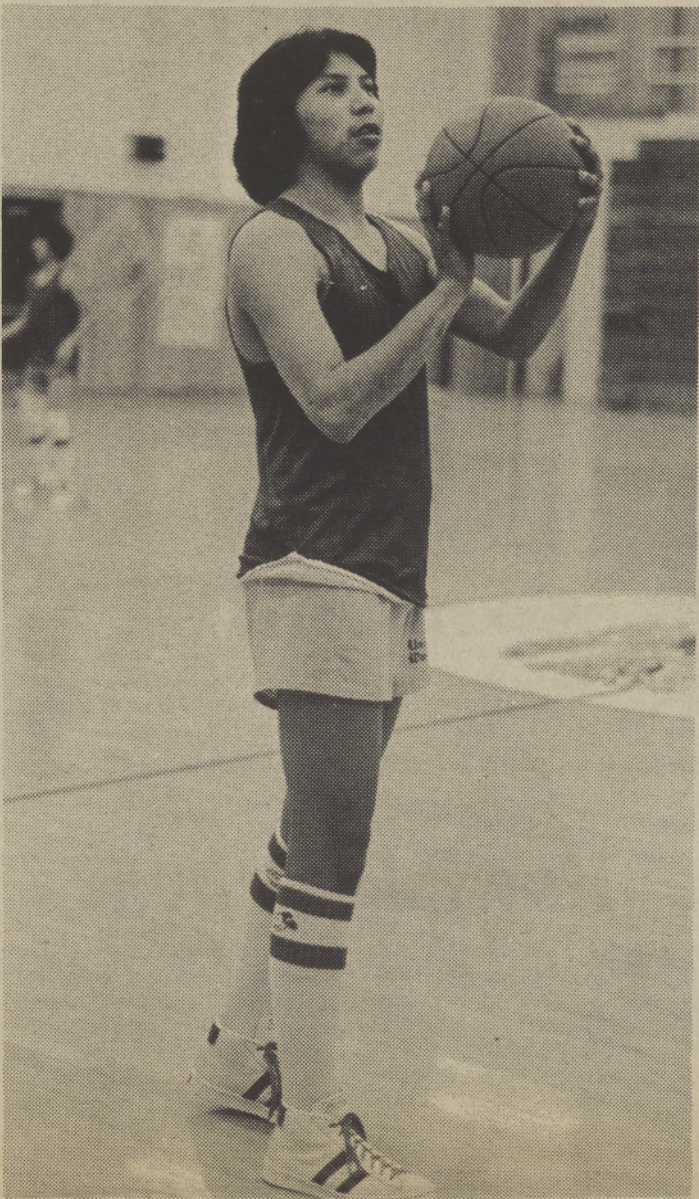


Rodney Mitchell

Kim is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Manion of Warm Springs.

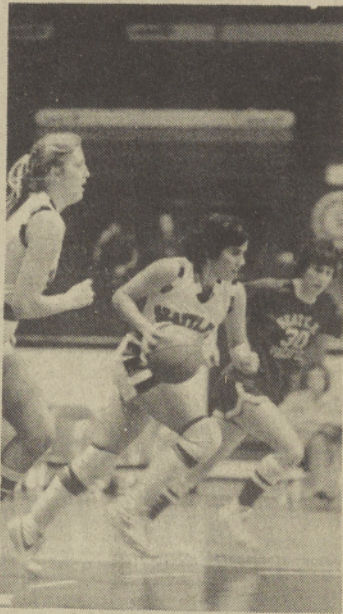

Mini Course In Beadwork

Johnson O'Malley funds provided a special beading program at Madras Jr. High School during the month of February. On Thursday, February 23, Mrs. Janice Clements spent some time with Ms. Zalewski's Art classes.

She showed the students examples of old and new beadwork and demonstrated how to make a loom as well as how to bead on a loom.

The beading process is a long one involving a wooden loom, a shuttle, string, beads, needles, and a variety of bead sizes. Patterns are designed on paper by the student so he or she will not lose track of the design while beading.

"This has been a worthwhile learning experience for my students who seem to have gotten very involved in the process," said Zalewski.

Community Liaison Marie Calica and Principal Phil Riley have recommended that the Johnson O'Malley funds be shared this year by the Art department and the Music department. The music program is currently in the planning stages.
