Tribal Administrative Director Yakima Indian Nation

The Tribal Council of the Yakima Indian Nation is looking for an exceptionally qualified individual to serve as a Tribal Administrative Director. Appointment to the position will be made by the Tribal Council.

The Administrative Director will coordinate the activities of the Tribal Council and its eight standing committees and will be responsible for administering the six-hundred-employee tribal organization.

The Administrative Director develops and administers the

annual tribal budget complete with performance review; interprets and applies the financial and personnel policies and procedures across all tribal programs and recommends additional policy initiatives for consideration by tribal council and the standing committees.

Applicants should have a minimum of a bachelor's degree in business administration, public administration or a related field. Favorable consideration will be given to applicants having management experience with federal, state, local or tribal governments or business organizations.

Applicants must have had

experience in organization development, team building, and financial management. Candidates will be rated on a point system according to their qualifications. Preference points will be added for qualified Indian applicants. Applications must be postmarked on or before 12:00 midnight April 7, 1978.

POSITION: Community Health Representative (C.H.R.) for the Hootenai Tribe of Idaho at Bonners Ferry, Idaho

QUALIFICATIONS: Must have valid drivers license and furnish own transportation. This position requires a three (3) week training course at Black Hills Training Center, Rapid City, South Dakota or Desert Willow

Springs Training Center, Phoenix, Arizona. Upon return will perform all duties of a C.H.R. that will include setting appointments, transporting patients to and from medical, dental, optometric appointments. This person must also be a good contact person readily and able to speak to various professionals in the various Health, Education and Welfare, and other government agencies and able to keep daily

records and write monthly reports. This person must be of sound moral character.
