What About Childhood Immunization?

Nearly all parents know that young children need to be given immunizations (shots) early in life. Often times it is difficult for parents to keep track of what shots have been given let alone the type or purpose of each shot. Perhaps a few words of explanation would help improve this situation. The first immunization an infant should receive is called the "D.P.T."

The D.P.T. vaccine is a combination of three different immunizations given to younger children to prevent Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis, or Whooping Cough. Children receive three doses in their first year of life and boosters at eighteen months of age and again before starting school.

Children may develop a slight fever and some crankiness the day or two after immunization with D.P.T. Some soreness

or swelling at the site of injection may occur for one or two days after the shot.

A very few children may develop a higher fever following the shot. But the seriousness of Tetanus, Diphtheria or Whooping cough and the ability to protect children from them with a DPT shot makes the immunization against these diseases worthwhile.

DIPHTHERIA caused by a bacteria, is spread by contact with infected people and carriers. The bacteria may cause an infection in the nose and throat which can interfere with breathing, it may affect skin, or at times it may cause heart failure or paralysis. About one person out of every ten who gets Diphtheria dies from it.

TETANUS, or Lockjaw, is an infection in a wound caused by tetanus bacteria found in soil, manure or dust. The bacteria in the wound creates a poison which contracts muscles. Tetanus is not transmitted from person to person.

PERTUSSIS, or Whooping cough, causes severe spells of coughing which can interfere with breathing. It is spread by bacteria present in secretions from the mouth and nose. Convulsions, brain damage and death may occur, most often in very young infants.

As is true with any type of immunization a very small number of those receiving it may encounter complications (about 1 in 7000) however the protection provided is far greater than the possible risk. In the next issue the oral polio vaccine and the measles, mumps and rubella immunization will be discussed.
