HATCHERY DEDICATION SET

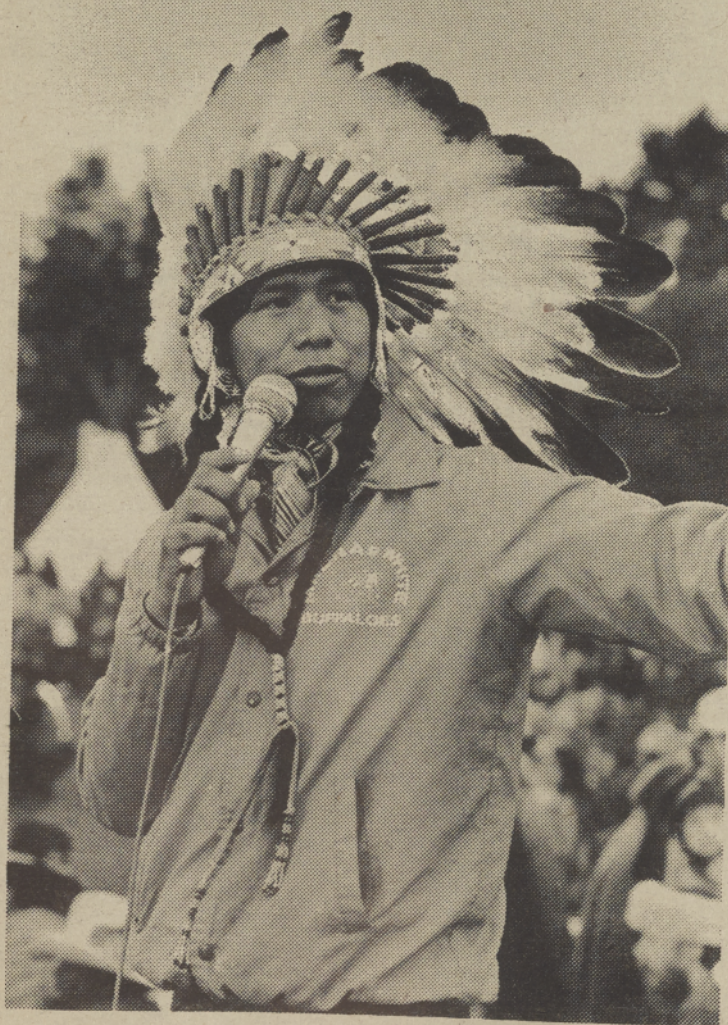
Dedication of the Warm Springs National Fish Hatchery has been scheduled for August 26.
