

# BITS AND PIECES FROM THE W.S.I.R.A.

The recent election results on the issue presented to the Western States Indian Rodeo Association membership was very discouraging according to a spokesman for the group.

The issue brought up by the board of directors at a meeting held at Tygh Valley in May was, "That all members belonging to the W.S.I.R.A. be fined if they participated in any rodeo other than W.S.I.R.A. sanctioned shows."

After the ballots were tallied

here are the results: There were twenty-one votes for the issue and twenty-eight against, with one hundred forty-one members not voting. So it is uncertain just which way the issue went at this point.

W.S.I.R.A. sanctioned rodeos that will be coming up in the near future at the following places are Ft. Hall on August 11, 12, & 13th; a rodeo at Usk, Washington the third weekend in August. On September 16th and

17th, there is one scheduled for Shears, Nevada; and one at Wellpinit, Washington sometime in September.

Currently leading each event are the following: bareback-Jerry Sam, saddle bronc-Oliver Louis, steer wrestling-John Mesplie, bull riding-Gary Sam, calf roping-Garrett Spoonhunter, cow milking-Jr. Adams, team roping-Rick Hooper, and the barrel race-Marita Johnson. ## ANYONE FOR POOL?

There is no better way to relax after a hard day's work than a good game of pool. This will put your mind at ease.

Here are some hints to becoming a good pool player.
