

Tags To Hunt In Ceded Area Available

Deer Hunting Season Nears

The Natural Resources Department will again be issuing free State licenses to enrolled tribal members for deer hunting in the ceded area. Tags will be issued from September 25 to 29 only, and the season for mule deer east of the Cascades is from September 30 to October 11.

Tribal Wildlife Biologist Terry Luther noted that to obtain a state license, hunters must be a Tribal Member, must be at least 14 years old, and must possess a Columbia River hunting and fishing license.

Those who do not already have a Columbia River hunting and fishing license may fill out an application for one at the Natural Resources office in the old agency building.

But Luther warns that it usually takes from 10 to 14 days to process the applications. So anyone wishing to pick up a state license in time for the deer hunting should apply for the

Columbia River license right away.

Tribal members who hunt in the ceded area are reminded that the limit is one buck deer and that they must abide by all state regulations.

Regulations include:

— A limit of one buck deer having not less than a forked antler (a two-point or larger).

— Hunters must have in their possession a Columbia River hunting and fishing card.

— A hunter must have in his/her possession a state license.

— Any juvenile less than 18 years of age must have on his/her person a Hunter Education Certificate.

— Respect private property. Hunters need permission to cross or hunt on private property.

Luther plans to have maps of the ceded area on hand to give out along with the free state deer

tags. And he urges all hunters to read a copy of the 1978 Oregon Game Mammal General Regulations or a synopsis. The regulations are available at any agency selling licenses.

Tags for deer hunting on the reservation continue to be issued monthly and Luther said the Natural Resource Department greatly appreciates those who make the effort to return the reply portion of the tag to the box at Macy's.

He said, however that the special state tags have no reply stub, but that some data return on the deer that are taken would be appreciated. This information can be brought to the Natural Resources office.

Luther reminds those who will be hunting in the ceded area that the deer tag must be attached securely to the animal.

Any questions about hunting in the ceded area should be directed to the Natural Resources Department.

Deer Tag Drop Box

Hunters are reminded that a box is available at Macy's store for the reply portion of their deer tags. The Natural Resources Department needs the information about deer taken on the reservation for monitoring purposes. Without such data, it is difficult to study migratory patterns or to keep count of the deer.

Tribal Wildlife Biologist Terry Luther said there was a good response from the hunters last year and an increasing number of tags are being issued. In 1977, there was a 36 percent return rate in the drop box. Luther expresses appreciation for the cooperation, and hopes that this year's return will be even better.

Protect The Steelhead

The Fish and Wildlife Committee expresses concern on the status of this years run of steelhead in the Deschutes river. Present indications are that the run size may be below normal.

The Committee is requesting that the Tribal fishermen in the

Deschutes River help to minimize the steelhead catch by returning to the river all unharmed steelhead.

The Tribal Natural Resources Department will be monitoring the Steelhead harvest closely. If it continues to appear that there is a small run and the harvest is

not reduced voluntarily, it may be necessary to restrict the take-in of Steelhead from the Deschutes River.

The Fish and Wildlife Committees' first responsibility is for the protection of the resource, and hopefully with full cooperation from the Tribal Fishermen.

Would you like to send a post card carrying the photo of the present Miss Warm Springs, Jackie Estimo?

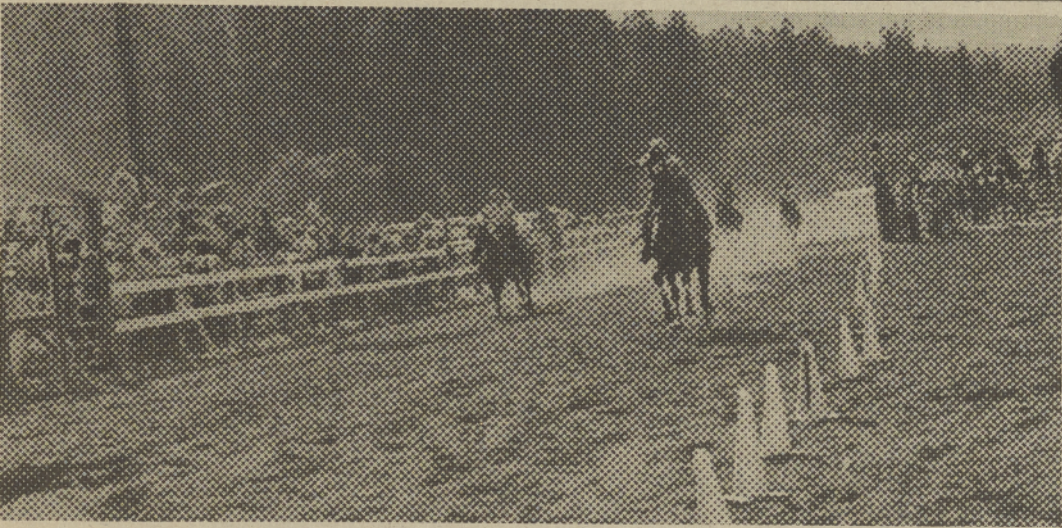
Steno Pool recently photographed Miss Warm Springs in front of the Tribal Administration building dressed in her traditional Indian regalia.
