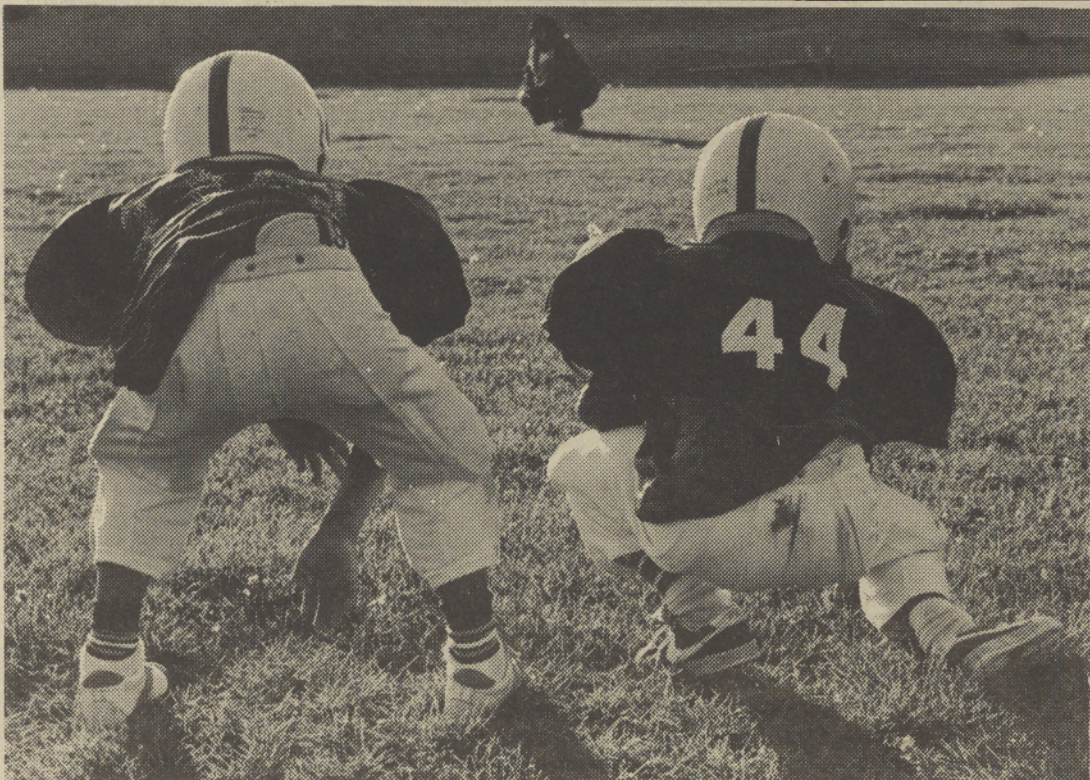

Madras Loses First Two Games, Faces Milton-Freewater

After losing to Redmond, 28-13, and getting whipped by Gladstone, 25-0, the Madras White Buffaloes face Milton-Freewater in the first league game of the season tonight at Milton-Freewater.

Milton-Freewater is picked to win the league championship this season, according to Coach Rod Chester. "It'll be tight," stated Chester.

In the Madras-Redmond game, Coach Chester blamed the loss on a couple of punt returns that were bad for the Buffaloes. He said Redmond had a good punting game. The Madras team

still had a chance to win, but with only four minutes left on the clock in the last quarter, the Redmond Panthers scored on a Madras fumble.

We need to be more aggressive than we actually were," said the veteran coach.

In the Madras-Gladstone game, Chester said the team wasn't consistent. "We weren't aggressive defensively. As a result, we ended up losing things we shouldn't have. We got the ball down there, but we don't have the consistency to keep it going and score," commented the coach.

Boxing Club Forms Under New Coach

Boxing practice, under the supervision of a new coach, is scheduled to begin Monday, Sept. 25, at 4:30 p.m. at the Warm Springs Community Center. It's for anyone eight years old and older.

Boxers should have their physical examinations as soon as possible. They are expected to come to practice with regular work-out gear and mouth-pieces, if they have them.

The new coach is Fabian Sutterlee, a former boxer. Sutterlee started boxing in Warm Springs when he was six years old. Then he moved to Yakima, Wash., where he boxed for the Y.M.C.A. Later, he joined the Wapato Club.

Sutterlee's better boxing days were when he was in the Marine Corps. He was runner-up in the featherweight division in the Marine Corps championships. In 1964, while he was still in the Marine Corps, Fabian was runner-up in the Olympic trials in the featherweight division.

Sutterlee will be assisted with the boxing team by Ronnie Governor and Austin Smith. The club's first bout will be in mid-November according to Sutterlee, after the boxers have had time to get into shape. Off in the future Sutterlee sees hosting a boxing clinic with a known fighter. Although it isn't definite, Sutterlee hopes to have Danny Lopez, the current featherweight champion of the world, conduct the clinic. If Lopez is unable to make it, a fighter from the Portland area will be brought in.
