that this hearing will damage the relationship established between the four treaty tribes and the state of Oregon, nor will it jeopardize the comprehensive plan."

The hearing was quite brief and reportedly Attorney General Jim Redden, on behalf of the state, did not offer prolonged argument against the cut-off.

All parties have been left to wonder what happened to the expected salmon run. According to the state department the August season was progressing as expected but "something happened" and the salmon arrived at Bonneville up to a week behind schedule. Last year's

prediction was also off target but the lower river season had already been open too long when the error was discovered.

Said Karnopp, "The tribes and the state will be studying ways to manage the resource so that runs will be larger and more predictable."

According to Robinson, the state department is looking into the feasibility of releasing hatchery fish in the upper river to balance the surplus of lower river salmon and the scarcity of upriver fish.

The method used to predict returns is also being examined to ensure more reliable figures in future years.
