JOEY AND REDHAWK, the first young people's weekday mini-series, will premiere on Monday, December 4 on the CBS Television Network. JOEY AND REDHAWK is the story of two 14-year-old boys from completely different backgrounds who meet and resolve some of the difficulties and heartaches of growing up and dealing with the adult world as together they face hardships, dangers, and challenges in the wilds of the Colorado Rockies.

Tom Redhawk, a full-blooded Indian, is in conflict with older traditional Indian ways and with the white world of which he is a part when he attends a government school.

Joey Harker, a sensitive boy from a middle-class Ohio family, faces the pressure of his parents to emulate the achievements of an accomplished, athletic older brother who died in a tragic

accident.

Brought together by emergency circumstances, the boys strike up a wary relationship. As they discover more about each other, however, their mutual respect increases. Alone, and in a situation requiring great courage and strength, the boys find

through their independence a new self-worth.
