Christmas Tree Cutting

In keeping with the spirit of Christmas, the Confederated Tribes have consented to the cutting of Christmas trees in reservation forests, said James Cornett, BIA Superintendent.

This privilege is being extended to employees of the Warm Springs Agency and Indian Health Service, the Warm Springs Grade School, Warm Springs churches, and residents of the Kah-Nee-Ta employee

housing units.

Cornett offered the following rules for tree cutting:

— Cutting is limited to one tree per family (or classroom) and on tribal lands only.

— Trees should be cut away from the main road and close to the ground.

— All live branches should be removed from the stump.

— Topping of trees and cutting trees larger than 12 feet

in height is not permitted.

— Trees should not be cut that do not have another tree growing within 12 feet of the tree to be cut.

— Cutting is not permitted in areas where tree thinning has been performed.

Information on tribal land location and road conditions should be obtained from the Branch of Forestry.

Aripa Retiring From Roads

Planning to return to his home on the Coeur d'Alene reservation, Felix Aripa is retir-

ing after 34 years of service with the government. Four of those years were in the Navy, the

remainder has been with BIA roads.

Aripa has worked in Warm Springs for the last 12 years as a survey technician and also worked on the maintenance of heavy equipment.
