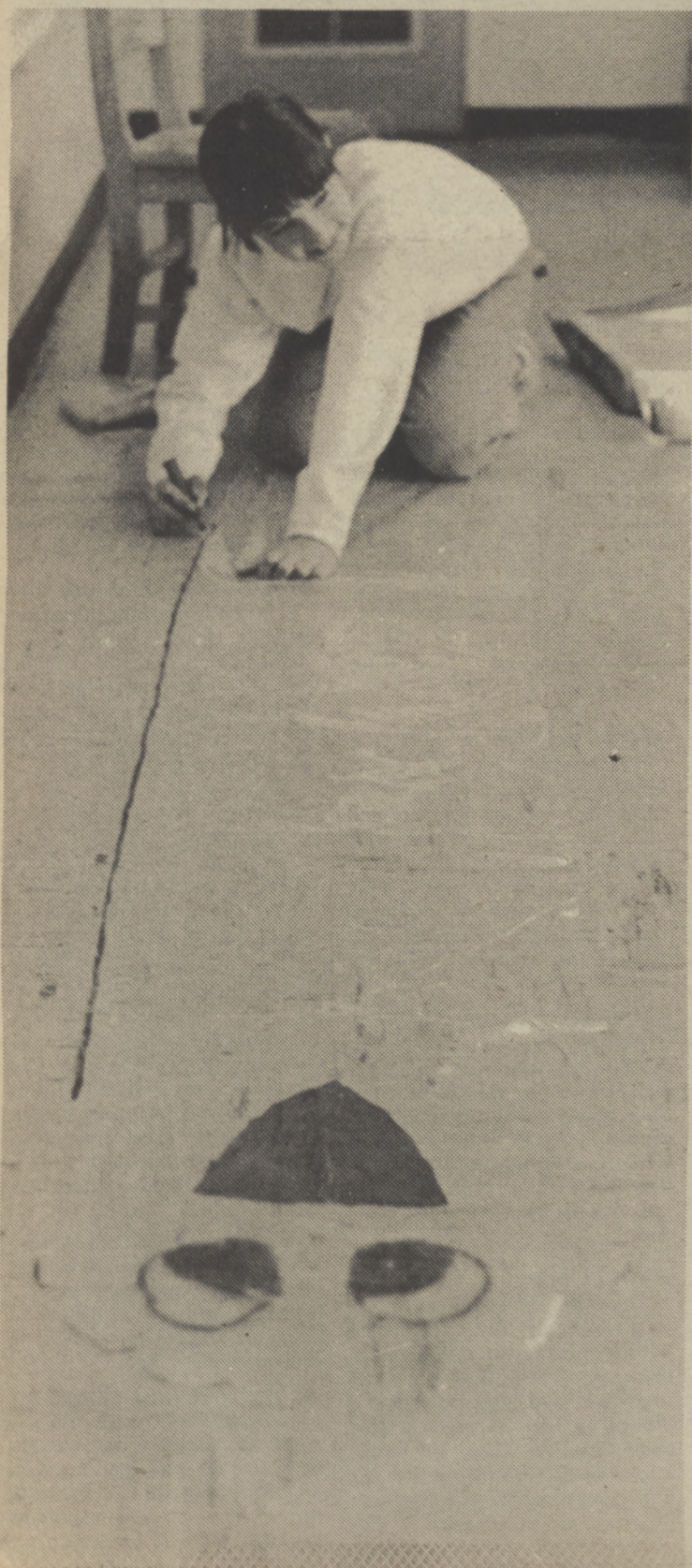


Grade School Looks to Spring



Mini-courses, the Warm Springs Grade School's cure for spring fever, are more outdoor oriented this year.



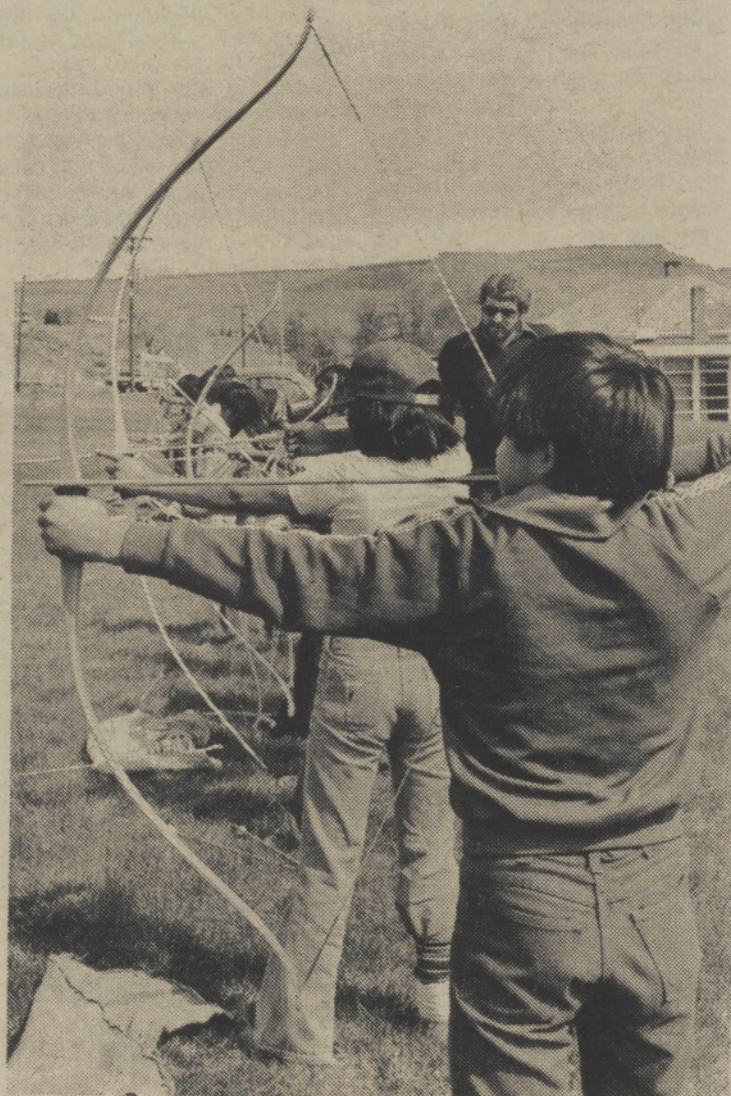
Mini-courses, sponsored by Johnson O'Malley and taught by teachers, JOM aides, and parents, have gone outdoors this year.
