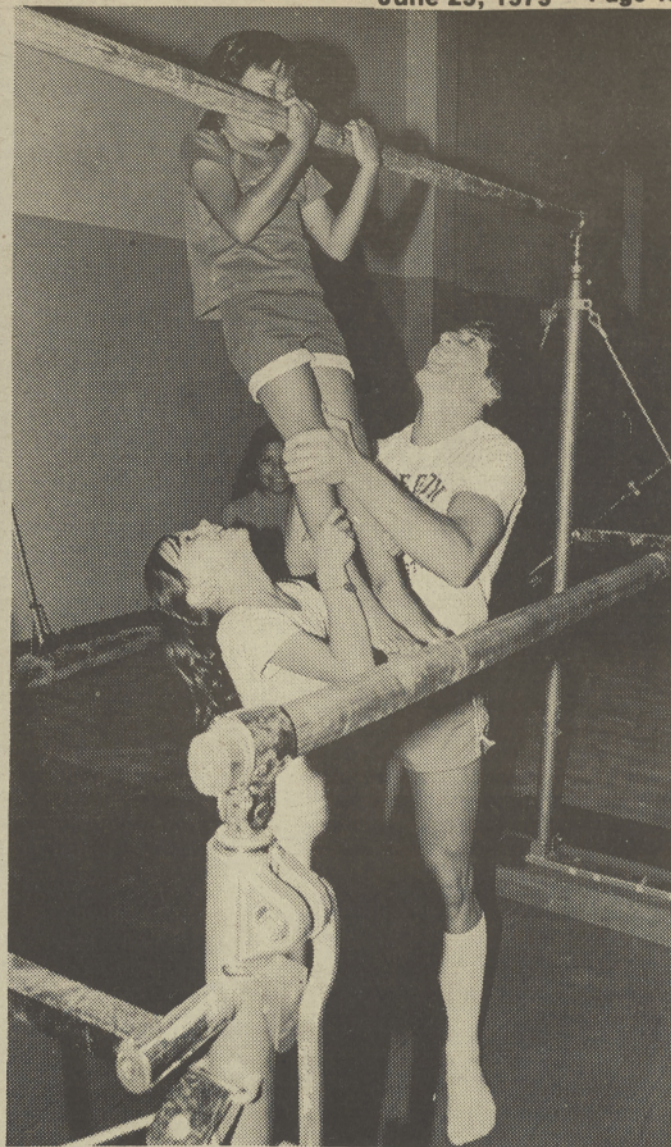

FOOTINGS AND FOUNDATIONS - Since mid-April, Bonneville Power Administration crews have been digging the foundations and placing footings for the 125-foot transmission line towers which will cross 16 miles of the northwest corner of the reservation. The work is now approaching Highway 26 near HeHe Butte. The 500-kv double circuit transmission line and towers should be up by October 1980 when the project is scheduled for completion.
